The first thing to say is DON'T PANIC.

I have had countless conversations over the last few weeks regarding this change, so I just wanted to put this in the Kingsley News. From 1st October 2023 the rules are changing so the patient will have to order their monthly prescriptions themselves. Patients can order online via the NHS app or Patient Access, hand the repeat slip in at the surgery, post your repeat slip to the surgery or by emailing your order to your respective surgery. All pharmacies are no longer allowed to order for most patients from 1st October. There are exemptions so please ask us at Holland Pharmacy for details if you think that you will struggle to order your medicines.

YOU CAN CONTINUE TO GET YOUR PRESCRIPTIONS DISPENSED AT HOLLAND PHARMACY REGARDLESS OF HOW YOUR ORDER YOUR PRESCRIPTION. JUST SPECIFY HOLLAND PHARMACY ON YOUR REQUEST.

THE ONLY THING THAT IS CHANGING IS HOW YOU ORDER YOUR MEDICINES AND NOT WHERE YOU PICK UP YOUR MEDICINES SO YOU CAN CONTINUE TO PICK UP YOUR MEDICINES AT HOLLAND PHARMACY IF YOU SO WISH.



The Meaning of Rest

'Are you tired? Worn out? Burned out on religion?



Come to me. Get away with me and you'll recover your life. I'll show you how to take a real rest. Walk with me and work with me – watch how I do it. Learn the unforced rhythms of grace. I won't lay anything heavy or ill-fitting on you. Keep company with me and you'll learn to live freely and lightly.' *Matthew 11: 28-30 The Message Bible*

These are comforting life giving words for those who are feeling under pressure, tired and possibly exhausted. We look at the summer as a time for holidays and resting but just round the corner comes September and back on the treadmill we get of endless activity and availability - did we really take a rest? When I was on my Ordination Retreat one of my tutors sent me a book called 'Jesus had a Day Off.' This was a reminder that we too need to take time out not just a once a year holiday but at regular intervals. Jesus gave himself permission to stop and so must we.

In his book 'Working from a place of rest' Tony Horsfall writes, 'In striving to do our utmost for God, we can easily forget that there were many times when Jesus himself was willing to rest, to do nothing except wait for the Spirit's prompting, so that he demonstrated the vital principle of 'working from a place of rest. If we are constantly giving out to others, we must make sure that we take in for ourselves, otherwise we will wear out'

I wonder if like me you take a coffee break thinking you are taking time out but your mind keeps working overtime. Then at night-time you are either still buzzing from the day's activities and unable to sleep or you wake in the early hours anticipating the day ahead.

So then

What refreshes your soul? What re-energises you?

How can you ensure that you are looking after your own well-being so that you can sustain yourself over the long haul of life, work and ministry?

'Loving God, help us to recognise when we need refreshment and rest. Help us not to be afraid to take time apart or ask for help, and fill us with optimism for what you can do through the lives of those who rest in you. Amen.'



KINGSLEY PARISH COUNCIL



The following items are based on the Parish Council meeting held on the 18th July 2023, the Parish Council does not meet in August, the next Council meeting will be on 19th September 2023.

It is somewhat strange in July that the subject of village Christmas lights was discussed at the meeting. The existing Christmas lights that have appeared at The Brow and Christmas Tree over the years are owned and installed by the Parish Council, but time has taken its toll and many have now failed. Discussions with and a quotation, have been received from a national company who supply and install Christmas Decorations throughout the UK. The Council considered the quotation, and at this time has agreed to appoint the company to decorate the two trees at The Brow for one year only with an option for extending this a further two years. At this time, the main Christmas tree, and the tree at The Cross, will continue to be supplied and decorated by the Parish Council in 2023.

Proposals were put forward to the Council by a Councillor, to allow more border areas around the perimeter of the Playing Field to return to wild meadow. These areas would be uncut throughout the year and monitored for natural wild flower species, etc;. The Council would welcome views and areas which could be considered for the 2024 growing season from Spring onwards.

Whilst on this theme, the Council have approached Cheshire West with regards to replacing the tree brought down by lightning on Brookside earlier this summer.

The Council is proposing a "Community Tidy Up Day" in Spring 2024. Some specific projects and areas will be highlighted for the day, but once again the Council would welcome suggestions for areas that would benefit from this day. The precise date and time will be announced in later Kingsley News in the New Year.

Another date for your diaries for 2024, again around March, will be a Public Consultation meeting dealing with the proposed purchase of a plot of land adjacent to the existing cemetery. This will provide future expansion in the decades to come, as our existing cemetery is filled. A date for the Consultation meeting and more detailed proposals, will be presented prior to the meeting.


