Our 2025 Interrail Adventure - by Jane Harris

Earlier this year Malcolm and I were inspired by friends' plans to go on an Interrail trip and in May we embarked on an adventure around Europe. The last time I had done such a holiday was as a student in the 1970's, when it was a cheap way of getting abroad, along with a backpack and sleeping bag! These days, however, seniors can pay an additional £50 which allows first class travel for the duration of the trip, making for a much more comfortable and luxurious experience.

Saturday 3rd May saw us and our backpacks at Runcorn Station at 5.40h for the first train of the day to Euston. We had a first-class coach all to ourselves and were duly served with bacon rolls and coffee (unfortunately the catering facilities were not at full capacity so our much-anticipated full English breakfast available!). From Euston Station we walked the Wellbeing Route behind the Euston Road to St Pancras where we took the Eurostar to Paris. At Paris a guick jaunt on the metro to Gare du Nord took us to our upper deck first class seats on the TGV where we shared space with a well-behaved French pooch and owner, crossing France to arrive in Nice at 9pm.



Our three day stay in Nice involved a nostalgic visit to the beautiful walled village of St Paul de Vence, where I'd lived and worked some 50 years ago, a trip to opulent Monaco and lazy meandering around the flower market and Promenade des Anglais.

Despite a French and an Italian train strike we managed to reach our next stop in Vernazza, one of the pretty Italian villages forming part of Cinque Terre, the five villages perched on the side of the cliffs in north west Italy. Our accommodation was right on the tiny harbour where we enjoyed a lively atmosphere, fabulous cliff walks and boat rides. We were lucky enough to be right next to the church the night the new Pope was elected and were treated to hours of celebratory bell ringing.

From Cinque Terre a night jet train took us to Vienna. A big contrast to be in a bustling city full of impressive baroque architecture, fabulous art galleries, churches, parks, statues, fountains and cafes. The Kunsthistorisches Museum which houses the former collections of the Hapsburgs has to be one of the world's most elaborate and decorative art museums. A highlight was a visit to the Vienna State Opera, which we'd booked well in advance, we felt like

like royalty taking an aperitif in the fabulous balcony and loved the performance of Tosca which we watched from the vertiginous heights of the third tier. Another trip was to the Donau Island on the Danube and to visit a Flak tower to include Malcolm's interest in WW2. For those of you who are not in the know, this is a huge edifice built to defend the city and to act as an air raid shelter for several thousand people. It was so huge it could not be decommissioned, so now stands in the extensive Augarten Park on the outskirts of the city.

From Vienna we travelled in our mostly empty first-class train compartments through stunning scenery across Austria to Chur in Switzerland where we stayed for one night in a converted prison! An unusual setting, which was, as you'd expect, spartan, but our ensuite cell room had the most comfortable bed of the holiday, and the ensuite bathroom had a heated floor! Walking round town we happened on five alpenhorn players in the park and in the old town came across hundreds of children – found out that we'd arrived on the day when every school child in Chur goes on a mountain walking day, arriving back down early evening to be accompanied in procession round town by four brass bands. A wonderful festive atmosphere and great fun.



A multi-train panoramic journey on regional trains took us from Chur to Disentis, another to Andermatt, then Brig and finally Speiz to Interlaken. Mostly in empty first-class carriages so we could open windows and were able to dash from side to side to for the stunning scenery through Swiss meadows, mountains and lakes. The rack and pinion tracks seemed to defy gravity at times as they climbed up impossibly steep inclines and we held our breath on the descents. Arriving in Interlaken we were surrounded by imposing snowcapped mountains and the deep blue water of the lakes. The best walk of the holiday was when we took the funicular railway 1322m up the Harder Kulm mountain, then continued on foot to the Harter Fruende viewpoint summit at 1585m. This was an exhilarating escape from the crowds, spectacular views in glorious sunshine, followed by a beer at Harder Kulm where a glamourous wedding reception provided entertainment before we tackled the 2.5 hour descent back down to town.



We left Interlaken on a rack and pinion railway over a mountain pass. On to Lucerne, a quick peep out from the railway station there, over a medieval wooden bridge crossing the River Reuss. Then to Zurich and Schaffhausen passing the Rhine Falls, Singen and Konstanz. At Konstanz we made a catamaran trip to Friedrichshafen to visit the fascinating Zepplin Museum. Crossing the 42-mile long lake we watched a modern Zepplin flying rich sightseers, not for the fainthearted! In the evening we followed up notices we'd seen in town for two concerts one after the other in different churches and thoroughly enjoyed first an organ and trumpet recital then a remarkable Ukrainian accordion quartet which ran through a programme of classical composers.

Our next stop was Koblenz, via Baden-Baden which took us through the lovely rolling countryside of the Black Forest. From Baden-Baden to Koblenz we were constantly flirting with the Rhine River, getting across, putting some distance between us and then cosying up again. There is a constant stream of barges and river cruisers on this mighty river and an odd juxtaposition of ancient castles, modern campsites and motorhomes on the banks. Koblenz is situated on the confluence of the Rhine and the Moselle, again lots of beautiful parks, churches and statues, plus a fabulous cable car over the Rhine. After a sunny river cruise, we took the cable car to visit the imposing Festung Ehernbreitstein fortress enjoying lunch on the Battery terrace taking in far reaching views.

Our final short stop was in Cologne where we did a whistle stop tour of the city, taking in the vast imposing cathedral which famously escaped bombing whilst the town around it was flattened in WW2. A stroll round the old town where we saw processions of newly weds leaving the town hall, feted by family and friends singing and handing out red roses. Down to the Rhine and across the Hohenzollernbrucke flanked by statues of various emperors on horseback. There are millions of lovers' padlocks attached the entire width, which must be adding significant weight to the bridge. Spent our last evening in a Bierhalle, toasting the success of this adventure and wondering where to go next.

Train from Cologne to Brussels Midi was uneventful and we were offered seats on an earlier Eurostar, so grabbed the chance to arrive back in London before rush hour. We enjoyed our refreshments on Eurostar and toasted our friends who had first put the idea into our heads and who themselves were setting off for Strasbourg as we returned.

KINGSLEY WALKERS



The warm (or even sweltering) summer months can signal a change in the routine for local walkers. Whilst many regulars briefly disappear, to take holidays, to perform their duties as grandparents, or (in my case) to go off sailing around the UK. However, the desire for a good walk continues, recent weeks have seen pleasant excursions to the hills of the Western Peak District, the area around the Anderton Boat Lift and Budworth (not the Little one), whilst a lunch at the Bells Of Peover Pub was calorifically justified by a few miles walking.

Some walkers, in recent years had enjoyed and even felt uplifted, by the book, The Salt Path. A tale of a middle aged couple whose shared life and his health seemed to unravel in a short space of time at the start of the book. However, it is surely indisputable that the positive physiological and psychological benefits of a good walk, in fine scenery and, above all, good company remains.
