Launching the Parish Plan Project in Kingsley

Public Meeting – Monday 25th October 2010

7.30pm

A Parish Plan is a document setting out how we, Kingsley residents, want to see the area develop over the next few years. It can cover a range of issues, and gives us a recognised voice.

Parish plans are evolving documents, outlining how a community would like to develop over the next 10 years. It will include a vision for the future, an expression of the residents' views and an action plan detailing how these developments can be achieved.

For the plan to be effective, it needs YOUR input! For the plan to have weight, it needs to be able to demonstrate that all the villagers have had an opportunity to give their input. To do this, we need to set up a number of groups from within the Parish.

The Steering Group

To co-ordinate the overall activity, there is also a Steering Group to "project manage" the generation of the plan. Their key activity will be to manage the distribution and collation of a Parish Questionnaire - this is the way we will encourage everyone to have their say. Members of the Working Groups will then get together with the Steering Group to analyse the results and produce the Parish Plan.

The Working Groups

The groups will act as a focus for the work and will be responsible for generating their parts of the Parish questionnaire. The set of working groups will depend on what we identify as being important, but will include some or all of the following:

- Facilities for the young/elderly
- Businesses
- Environment
- Leisure/recreation

We will need leaders and volunteers for each group that we decide to have.

What Happens Next

A meeting will be held at 7.30 on Monday October 25th at the Community Centre to set up the Kingsley's Parish Plan project. We need people who will get involved in getting the project set up and underway. There will be some sample Parish Plans available at the first meeting. The Parish Plan will be ready for distribution by June 2011.

Who Should Get Involved?

Kingsley Players Go to War

Kingsley Players journey back to the First World War for their autumn production, “Oh What a Lovely War”.

The horror and humour of the trenches is portrayed through a series of sketches and popular songs of the time, first developed by Joan Littlewood’s Theatre Workshop in 1963.

Over the years, the award-winning musical play has become a modern classic and will be resurrected by director Lynn Pegler in a fresh new production on stage at Kingsley Community Centre, Wednesday 20th October – Saturday 23rd October. All performances start at 7.30pm.

Lynn explained: “Oh What a Lovely War is a fantastic show and many of the songs will be familiar. It manages to combine both humour and pathos, and we hope to have audiences laughing and crying in equal measure.

“No-one could be unmoved by this dreadful conflict, which left 10 million dead, 21 million wounded and 7 million missing. At Passchendaele alone, 13,000 men were slaughtered in three hours for a gain of only 100 yards. Apparently General Haig’s comment was: ‘Mostly gamekeepers and servants.’

“As the last surviving soldiers involved in this conflict pass away, productions like Oh What a Lovely War help to remind us of this terrible, fascinating pivotal episode in our history.”

KINGSLEY WALKING GROUP

On the 25th of August 17 intrepid explorers set out at 9.30 AM to walk the environs of Kingsley and to complete 5 miles and end up at the Tigers Head by 1 o'clock for lunch.

The first stile enabled some of us to get our socks wet but like the troopers we are no one complained. We continued crossing stiles and fields until after some time we reached Beech Lane where we took the road opposite leading into to a track which led us into Top Road and then up the Hurst to the Methodist Church where we had our mid morning refreshments.

Next to the Church there is a path which we took for the second part of our walk passing stiles and Farms until we reached the Quarry where Sand Martins used to Hollow out their nests in the Sand Cliffs. Not now to be seen on this walk. Finally we passed Town Farm and took a track into Hamblett's Hollow back to the Tigers Head where our lunch was prepared for us.

On 16 September, seven fully waterproofed walkers set off from Brine's Brow, Delamere, on September's long walk (just over seven miles). The rain and wind, light at first, increased as we headed towards Ashton and on behind Peel Hall. Heads were well down as we turned at Swinfordmill Farm to head in a southerly direction towards Hollowmoor Heath. Fortunately, both rain and wind abated as we turned in an easterly direction to return to Ashton. Lunch was taken at a dryish spot on the return leg of the walk, with blue patches of sky just visible as we enjoyed our sandwiches! Once back in Ashton village (in sunshine!) we headed up the bridlepath to the road near to Langley Farm, before dropping back down to our starting point.

Kingsley Walking Group have two walks each month, meeting at the Community Centre at 9.30am. On the second Tuesday there is a long walk, bring a packed lunch. Kingsley Gardening Club September Meeting

There was an excellent turnout for the new season of Kingsley Gardening Club at the meeting on September 13th in the Community Centre.

The talk on Composting was given by club member Simon Sherlock who is a 'Master Composter' on a council run scheme.

He told us that composting was very important in keeping waste from landfill, which ultimately costs us in our Community Charges.

Simon showed us the bins we could buy from the council and how to fill them. It is necessary to have thin layers of 'greens' with thicker layers of 'browns' such as cardboard. The thick layer needs to have plenty of air circulation.

Simon also showed us a wormery. The wormery produces excellent compost and a liquid which can be diluted and used as fertiliser on the garden or in the greenhouse. Cooked food cannot be put into the wormery and it is best to avoid citrus peel and onion skin, however many other items can be added and broken down in the wormery.

The final composting box was a Bokashi. Simon told us that all cooked items that are waste can go into this box. Specially impregnated bran is added and again excellent fertiliser is produced.

Simon answered lots of questions from the group and also later to individuals. The talk that Simon gave was very much appreciated by the club. He is available to give help and advice on composting to anyone in the village, so hopefully more people will start to have a go at composting.
