EDITORIAL NEWS AND VIEWS

Dear Readers

Autumn and Winter are approaching - some love these seasons, others are less keen! Shorter days limit opportunity for outdoor pursuits and cooler weather makes fireside armchairs more appealing. Those of a certain age will notice the effects that less exercise and cold damp conditions have on muscles and joints - aches and pains are more noticeable and persistent, so that we may be less inclined to go out and about - a spiral to guard against!

So too for our pets! You may not see overt lameness as your cat or dog moves about, but you might notice that they play less, their claws are longer, or they don't groom themselves so thoroughly and are less appreciative of a good pat! Depending on size, weight and breed dogs 'age' at different rates, but at 8 years old a Labrador size dog will certainly be starting to feel the aches and pains. Cats appear to be a little more youthful in some respects, but as far as their joints and muscles are concerned a 10 year old will certainly be less agile and active.

You can encourage and assist your pet to lead a more active life in older age. Firstly make sure that they are not overweight; feed a good quality food that is designed for the older less active animal; check that their claws, skin and coat remain in good condition; have a chat with your Vet if you suspect early joint problems such as arthritis as there are some excellent medicines available to help.

A Local Gem Sparkles Again

The Castle Park Arts Centre, a coveted local treasure in the historic town of Frodsham, is set to enhance its image as a unique venue to engage with the arts and hopes to firmly establish itself as the largest independent art gallery in Cheshire.

The Centre's Gallery 2 and adjoining room have undergone extensive refurbishment over the last three months and will be formally reopened on October 3rd. The revitalised gallery will enhance the Arts Centre's exhibition facilities and thereby attract a greater number of emerging and established artists throughout the region and beyond, who wish to promote their artworks.

The refurbishment project was funded from the Biffa Award; a multi-million pound environment fund managed by the Royal Society of Wildlife Trusts (RSWT), which utilises landfill tax credits donated by Biffa Waste Services) and from the Cheshire West and Chester Rural Support Funding Grant Award.

Gallery 2 will be formally opened by The High Sheriff of Cheshire; Susan Sellers, on Friday 3rd October at 7.30 p.m. before an evening of celebrations begin. Approximately 150 invited guests, including The Lord Mayor and Lady Mayoress of Chester, representatives from Cheshire West and Chester Council, Frodsham Town Council, the above sponsors plus Centre volunteers and members, will attend an evening's celebration of the reopening. The evening will be supported throughout by musical entertainment provided by local artists.

In keeping with the Art Centre's tradition of hosting a six week rolling programme of exhibitions, Gallery 2, once reopened, will display a collection of artefacts, photographs and documents chronicling the impact of the Great War on Frodsham's local community and remembering Frodsham's heroes of 1914-18. This exhibition presented by Frodsham Town Council, will be complemented by a display of additional artworks from local artists which will be on display in Galleries 1 and 3 at the Centre.

With the reopening of Gallery 2, the Castle Park Arts Centre, which will be up to full operational capacity once again, would therefore like to send a message to all artists and art groups that this unique venue, which has an increasing footfall year on year, is an ideal environment to exhibit, promote and network. Also in the summer, we were delighted to congratulate one of last standing members Hilary Tucker on being awarded an OBE in the recent Queen's Birthday Honours list for her work for the Probationary Service.

At the first meeting after our August break the first Lady Mounted Policewoman in the North West gave us both an interesting and entertaining talk on her experiences in that role which included descriptions of her training and the uniform changes over her 30 plus years in the Force.



KINGSLEY WALKING GROUP

The starting point for the short walk, on 27 August, was Stoneyford Cottage Nursery and Tea Room. The walk took in a section of the new Oakmere Way, a forested section, and open country around Norley.

The long walk on 9 September was to Moel Famau. Starting from the forest car park to the south-east, we climbed to the summit then continued north towards Cilcain before circling back. The intended route was 8.5 miles, but due to a momentary lapse in concentration we missed a chunk and managed only 6 miles. However, the eleven walkers enjoyed beautiful sunny weather and distant views, and were rewarded on the walk back with a siting of a Red Kite.

Kingsley Walking Group have two walks each month: on the second Tuesday there is a long walk of 7 - 8.5 miles (bring a packed lunch); on the last Wednesday a short walk of approximately 5 miles with a coffee break and pub lunch. We meet at the Community Centre at 9.30am (Note however an earlier start of 9.00am for the long walks from May to September). 
