Tennis Comes To Kingsley

Two recently refurbished all-weather tennis courts were opened at Kingsley & Newton Village Institute (KNVI) on Saturday 27th August 2016 by Mr Rob Forster, President of Cheshire County LTA. Mr Forster was accompanied by several members of the Cheshire County LTA Executive.

The refurbishment is one part of an on-going programme of improvements to KNVI that has been initiated by the new Management Committee that was put in place in February 2015.

The Tennis project has been made possible by generous funding from various people and organisations: the Kingsley Parish Council, CW&C Rural Support Programme, an anonymous donation, Borough Councillor Ralph Oultram, Frodsham Round Table, and Tesco, who took on the cost of refurbishing one of the courts through their Bags of Help initiative. Representatives from the Parish Council and Tesco were also present at the opening.

The new courts have attracted a lot of local interest and a new LTA Registered Tennis Club has been established under the auspices of KNVI. The newly convened Club has more than 80 members already and has engaged a Tennis Coach, Bill Connell, who has introduced a programme of coaching designed to appeal to all ages and abilities. 

Members of the public. Three members of the public attended the meeting.

<u>Firework Display (Kingsley Explosion)</u> Medcare are holding a bonfire/firework display on 29 October in Kingsley Playing Field.

<u>Planning applications</u>. Several planning applications were received and acted upon over the summer and a further four were discussed at the meeting.

<u>Playing Field</u> Kingsley Parish Council are planning further improvements to the playing field, cutting back vegetation and relocating 15 young trees.

<u>Village Enhancements</u> Kingsley Parish Council will be repairing benches within the parish and replacing some dying trees on the roadside verges.

<u>Highways</u> Trucks driving through the parish will be monitored regarding an increase in apparent volume and speed.

<u>Cheshire and Chester Council Local Plan Part 2</u> The public consultation is still in the draft stages and Kingsley Parish Council is forwarding comments as appropriate."

The short walk on 31 August was from Ashton. Starting from the parish church, we crossed to Broomhill via Peel Hall and Swinford Mill Farm, returning along fields of ripe barley into Ashton village. Back at the cars, we drove to The Goshawk for an enjoyable lunch. Seventeen took the walk, approximately 5 miles.

On 15 September nine of us enjoyed a splendid day out in Derbyshire in gorgeous weather. Parking a mile to the west the centre of Youlgreave, we set off westward along the Limestone Way. After dropping steeply into Cales Dale and climbing to regain our height, we were tempted to enjoy ice creams available at One Ash Grange Farm. We then entered the top of the beautiful Lathkill Dale, which was initially dry, but the river soon started to bubble up to support the lush vegetation and wildlife. After taking lunch by a shallow waterfall we continued to follow the river, crossing at Conksbury Bridge and along the broader meadow banks to Allport where we viewed the trout and a pair of dippers displaying themselves by the bridge. We finally reached Youlgreave, to enjoy a well earned drink in one of the pubs. A prior car shuttling enabled us to avoid the long climb back to the car park. Just over 8 miles.

Kingsley Walking Group have two walks each month: on the second Tuesday there is a long walk of 7 - 8.5 miles (bring a packed lunch); on the last Wednesday a short walk of approximately 5 miles with a coffee break and pub lunch. We meet at the Community Centre at 9.30am for the short walks and for the long walks in January and February. Note however an earlier start time of 9.00am for the long walks from March to November.
