<u>Vacancies for new Councillors</u>. Five applications have been received for the three vacancies on Kingsley Parish Council. It is anticipated that the vacancies will be filled by co-option at a meeting of the Parish Council to be held on 17 October 2017.

Mr Austin Walker has handed in his notice from his job as General Assistant. He has worked for Kingsley Parish Council for the last eighteen years and his work was much appreciated by all the Council and especially by Councillor Warburton and Councillor Moores with whom he worked closely. A letter of thanks was sent to Mr Walker from Kingsley Parish Council.

Dogs on the Playing Field. Nicki Rose, Lead Training Services Standard Practitioner from CWAC, updated the Parish Council regarding playing field by-laws. CWAC now have to replace the by-laws with Public Space Protection Orders (PSPOs). A consultation regarding PSPOs beginning in March 2018 to be concluded by November. The Parish Council will produce a survey for parishioners to comment upon regarding dog fouling. The Clerk will obtain signs to be placed around the playing field to remind dog owners of the need to clear up after their dogs. Dogs to be excluded from the fenced children's play area and signs are in place informing dog owners of this fact. Dogs are not excluded from areas containing play equipment that is not fenced. Dogs on leads cannot be enforced at the moment but maybe if included in a PSPO. Kingsley Parish Council is not responsible for the behaviour of dogs in the playing field, this is the responsibility of the dog owners. The above rules do not apply to assistance dogs. There are no restrictions on the number of dogs dog walkers can exercise and there are no particular regulations controlling dog walkers. If PSPOs are enforced after CWAC's consultation in 2018 then signs will be placed around the playing field clearly showing the regulations and who can enforce them.

Playing Field Funding Councillor Jones reported on the successful bids for grant applications for further play equipment within the playing field. Funding from Veolia Environmental Trust of £13,324 was received in full. Tesco Bags of Help Grant Scheme have also granted the project funding. Council's project along with two other projects will be decided by Tesco customers voting for their favourite scheme, so go along to your local Tesco to vote for Kingsley. The amount received will be either £4000, £2000 or £1000 depending on votes received.

Westbrook Farm Development, Hollow Lane. The proposal is for 6 properties to be developed consisting of two 2 bedroomed properties and four 3 bedroomed properties, as well as garages. The development will be within the boundary of the farmhouse and will keep the agricultural look of the properties. If planning agreed building should commence in Spring 2018 and completed within 18 months. Further information was given regarding possible development of the surrounding land at Westbrook as follows:- Orchard Possible reinstatement of the orchard adjacent to Hollow Lane and possible option to be offered back to the community, as public open space and or education facility. Retail Provision Possibility to provide a purpose built retail opportunity with off street parking 30 + spaces. Parking & School Drop-off Provision of off street parking to Hollow Lane 30 + spaces and opportunity to provide drop-off facility for the school . Traffic - Through Flow and Speed. Possible provision of a roundabout on Hollow Lane and other measures to provide traffic calming and a pedestrian crossing. Footpaths & Pavements Provision of footpath to Mill Street. Housing Possible conversion of redundant farm buildings to residential Provision of open market and local need housing. **General** A sympathetic increase in open market and affordable housing within the village will help to sustain community numbers. In turn, the increase in the population size of the community would help to sustain both local business and schools.

<u>Proposed 20mph in Kingsley</u> The proposals were discussed by Council who would be sending in their comments on the matter to (CWAC). Clarification is being sought regarding the 'criteria' used by CWAC when deciding on which roads would be affected and regarding several anomalies especially regarding Top Road and Brookside who do not appear to have been considered within the proposals.

<u>Neighbourhood Plan.</u>(NP) There will be an informal meeting in October for those showing interest in producing a NP which will be followed by a public meeting in November in order to decide whether there is enough public support to begin the formal process. Major refurbishment of Kingsley & Newton Village Institute

The extensive refurbishment of the Kingsley & Newton Village Institute building that has been funded by a £32,830 grant from funding body WREN, is now complete.

The money, awarded by WREN's FCC Community Action Fund, has been used to provide a new gas-fired central heating system; an electrical upgrade throughout the building; loft and cavity wall insulation; replacement of the roofline, and new windows and doors throughout. It is expected that all of this will improve energy efficiency at the Institute.

Steve Roberts, KNVI Chairman, believes the improved facility will benefit the people of Kingsley. He says: "These improvements will make a real difference to those who use our facilities: the people of Kingsley and the wider community. We are extremely grateful to WREN for providing funding as we would not have been able to go ahead without its support."

WREN is a not-for-profit business that awards grants for community, biodiversity and heritage projects from funds donated by FCC Environment through the Landfill Communities Fund.

Kingsley & Newton Village Institute held a well attended Open Afternoon with Barbecue on 2nd September 2017 when the much improved facilities were enjoyed by the villagers and users of the Institute.

- The ending was rushed. The bits about the elephants provoked two distinct camps, people loved them or hated them.
- Too long
- Easy to read
- The basic premise of the book would have put some people off had they known about it.

The book scored an a average of 3.4 out of 5 among the 9 people who came along.

In October will be talking about "The Good Liar" by Nicholas Searle. It's a first novel by an ex civil servant and it's about a pathological liar. This promises to provoke lots of discussion because of the length and subject matter.



Maids of Honour (Makes a dozen)

Pastry Mix

300g Plain Flour 200g Margarine

1 Tablespoon of Caster Sugar 4 Tablespoons of cold water

Make the short crust pastry by rubbing in the flour and margarine until you have fine breadcrumb texture. Add the sugar and water and mix to a soft dough. Role the pastry evenly and cut into 12 rounds using a fluted cutter. Place the rounds into a greased bun tin.

Filling

3 tablespoons of Raspberry 1 Tablespoon of sherry 50g of Ground almonds 100g of cater sugar Almond essence

Mix the jam and sherry together and put a small teaspoon into the base of each pastry case. Mix the ground almonds and sugar together add the beaten egg and a few drops of the almond essence. Spoon the mixture evenly into the 12 cases until all used up.

To decorate use any leftover pastry cut into thin strips to lay over the mixture in the shape of a cross. Bake at 160C fan oven for 30 minutes until risen and golden.

This has been handed down from my mother in law and is an old fashioned afternoon tea cake.

Kingsley Walking Group



There was a Short Walk, of just under 5 miles on 30 August, from Cotebrook. We followed lanes and field paths, passing by the mill pool and Utkinton Hall, into Utkinton village, returning to Cotebrook via Hollins Hill. On the way we attracted the closed attention of a large group of horses, and navigated cautiously around herds of cows with bulls in attendance, and some frisky bullocks, to add a bit of excitement. Afterwards, we enjoyed lunch at the Alvanley Arms.

The Long Walk, on 12 September, was a nine-miler from Castleton. From the centre of the village we climbed to Lose Hill, then followed the ridge to Back Tor and Hollins Cross. We picnic-ed in a sheltered spot before ascending over Mam Tor. The weather was favourable and allowed us great views all around. 
