The November 1918 armistice, which took effect on 'the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month', ended the four-year conflict and marked a victory for the Allies. The War claimed the lives of over 16 million people and involved over 100 countries from Africa, America, Asia, Australasia and Europe.

The Great War had an impact on the lives of everyone in every town and village in our country including here in Kingsley.

- Many men volunteered or were recruited to fight alongside trained soldiers on the battlefields of northern Europe;
- At home, farming communities played a crucial role in the war effort of all the combatant nations keeping the population fed, both military and civilian, was a key factor in maintaining not just physical strength but also morale and commitment to the war effort;
- With men away at war, help was needed in the workplace and so millions of women went to work in offices, factories, shops, transport and on farms;
- Thousands of wounded soldiers were returned to Britain for hospital treatment and convalescence. They were taken to existing military hospitals but soon, with the numbers of casualties increasing, more accommodation was required. Large public and private buildings, such as workhouses, schools and country houses were turned into hospitals.
- Children were expected to contribute as well boy scouts and girl guides had a vital role on the Home Front. Girl guides would make basic medical equipment for wounded soldiers, like bandages, swabs and slings. They also worked growing vegetables and delivering milk. Boy Scouts collected eggs for injured troops, protected roads and railway lines, and delivered messages.

To commemorate the lives of all those who took part in The Great War, several projects and events are taking place in the village in 2018.

- Kingsley Parish Council has commissioned a new landscaping and planting scheme to provide a more accessible and attractive setting for the Kingsley and Newton War Memorial (dedicated in 1923) at the Cemetery. The memorial lists the names of those who fought in both Wars and who came from Kingsley and Newton
- The parish council will also purchase and install two new benches commemorating the end of the war, at the Cemetery and The Cross, and install a display of poppies on The Brow one for each name on the war memorial. Pupils have been invited to design a small card detailing the names of those from the village who lost their lives.

On Remembrance Day itself – 11th November 2018, various events will be taking place as our community comes together to mark this important day of remembrance. We hope that you can join us.

- 11am Service at the Cenotaph, Kingsley Cemetery
- 11.45am Light lunch / refreshments at Kingsley St. John's Primary School. *Donations welcome*
- 1pm Performances from Kingsley Young Singers and Kingsley Players Youth Theatre in the Community Centre. Running time of each performance is approximately 30 minutes. Tickets free, donations welcome.
- 7.30pm Wartime singalong in the 'Red Bull', organised by Kingsley Players.

The September meeting was well attended with twenty six people enjoying a very interesting and informative talk by Kathryn Robey who is the Curator at The Dorothy Clive Garden. The gardens are located in Wiloughbridge, Market Drayton, Staffordshire, and were created by Col H Clive in 1940 for his wife Dorothy who had Parkinsons Disease. Dorothy died in 1942 but Col Clive continued his work through the 1940's and 50's on the initial 2 acres. In 1958 Col Clive entrusted the gardens to The Wiloughbridge Garden Trust and they have continued to expand the garden to its current 12 acres. The gardens are a must to visit, located on top of a hill and overlooking some beautiful Staffordshire countryside.

The Kingsley Garden Club committee were pleased at the turn out at this our first meeting of the 2018 / 19 season, but we must maintain this level of attendance as a minimum, and indeed double it if we are to ensure the KGC is to continue into the 2020's, and not go the way of the Produce Market. All are very welcome, please do come and join us and please bring the children! There is a Sunday school for children every week (Not in August) and those who presently attend, really do enjoy! Hi,

A couple of years ago we faced the closure of Kingsley Scout Troop due to our then leaders moving away from the area, disaster was narrowly avoided when 4 volunteers came forward to help and the Scout troop has continued under the leadership of Eandil and Jon ever since. Unfortunately, 2 adults just isn't enough to sustain the troop and we find ourselves struggling again. Our plea is that other people join the Scout leaders to take on part of the responsibility, it really doesn't have to be every week, but we'd love it if it was! All that is required is a willingness to help. For anyone considering a career in teaching, childcare, charity work or any youth based activity, this is great experience and looks fantastic on your CV.

Below is a letter from one of our Cub Leaders who puts it so eloquently:

"About 5 years ago, I stepped up into the role as Cub leader along with 3 other novices. The existing Cub leaders had both stepped down after many years of fantastic service and there was no one to take their places. If someone didn't step up, Cubs would have to fold. Disaster loomed!

A few weeks earlier, I had been to Cubs as a (reluctant) parent helper. I remember thinking about the children, looking at how much fun they were having, and knowing it was all about to come to a halt. Then and there I decided that I would have to do something about that. So I did.

At that time, I had Edward in Cubs (some of you may be fortunate enough to know him. He is incredibly talented, handsome, funny, did I say handsome?) and Katy (some of you may be fortunate enough to know her too. She is incredibly beautiful, talented, funny and sensitive. Takes after me!) was not yet in Beavers. Oh, the embarrassment and shame of Edward! The thought of his Mum being a Cub leader. It would only have been worse if I had come to his school to teach sex education!

But I didn't listen to him moaning. I ignored his sulking, donned my Cubs outfit and set my face to "undaunted" on that first night at the hut, in front of 18 or so cubs, all of whom were used to the style of the previous leaders.

We did spend some time with them re-living times past (That's not how we normally play this game/ do this task etc.) but again, I set my face to "I don't give a damn what you think, after all you are a child and I am an adult with a wealth of experience to offer you so shut up and get on with it". I did feel, on that first night at Cubs, that my legs had turned to jelly and I wondered if any of them would listen to me and do what I asked them to. But give a Cub a newspaper snowball, give a Cub some ice to shoot along a plastic sheet, and it doesn't take long before they listen to every last word.

And since then, my story has continued. I think I am OK at being a Cub leader. Sometimes I look at other leaders in other groups and compare myself and wonder why I can't be as organised (yes folks, I did say that!), efficient, generally fab as they are. But you know what? I have my own style and it is OK. In fact, sometimes, I think I am quite good.

So what do I get from all of this? Well, quite a lot really. Every Thursday, for 75 whole minutes (and sometimes a bit more) I get to forget about everything else but the children. And that is liberating.

More than that, so, so much more I have found out new things about myself. I can control a big group of nuts children WITHOUT SHOUTING! I can organise complex events like camp. I can plan. I can manage people (and manipulate them to do my evil bidding. Whoahaha....), I can rationalise and learn when things don't go to plan, I can regularly push myself out of my comfort zone. I could go on. But the point is that had it not been for Scouting, I wouldn't know those things about myself, even if other people may have done.

And still more..(now bear with me)....I have made so very many new friends. I have met people I never would have known and had experiences I never would have imagined. I have had the amazing privilege of being a part of dozens of children's memories and helping to shape them into more rounded individuals with self-belief and self-awareness.

Have I sold it to you yet? You should be thinking "Let me at it!" and I would be there right beside you, encouraging you to take up the challenge.

At this moment, Kingsley Scouts is in crisis. Not in Beavers or Cubs, but Scouts. Our Scout leaders are stepping down at the end of this term and we have no new leaders to take their place.

Kingsley Walking Group



On 29 August, we had a six mile walk, starting from the Hayhurst Arms at Bostock Green. We headed west via footpaths to reach the river Weaver, then north along the riverside to Vale Royal locks before circling back to the pub, where we enjoyed a good lunch. Eleven of us took the walk, refusing to be put off by the light drizzle.

Wet weather caused us to defer the September Long Walk for a week, to 18 September. The walk started from Trevor Rocks above Llangollen, reached via the road that winds up past the Sun Trevor hotel. We followed the Panorama route along the top of the limestone escarpment to World's End. where we dropped down through a wooded gulley, stopping for our picnic lunch. We returned via the Offa's Dyke path, first across scree, and finally to the road. We felt we were maintaining a good pace until we were overtaken by eight Port-a-loos. However, the latter clearly were lost and soon passed us again, going in the opposite direction. Visibility was good after the recent rain and the seven of us enjoyed lovely views down to and across the Vale of Llangollen throughout this 10 mile walk.

Kingsley Walking Group have two walks each month: on the second Tuesday there is a long walk of 7 - 8.5 miles (bring a packed lunch); on the last Wednesday a short walk of approximately 5 miles with a coffee break and pub lunch. We meet at the Community Centre at 9.30am for the short walks and for the long walks in January and February. Note however an earlier start time of 9.00am for the long walks from March to November.
