#### FARM UPDATE

#### OCTOBER 2007

What a glorious autumn we are having. The trees are turning shades of reds and yellows. The frosty mornings and sunny afternoons are causing the leaves to start falling earlier this year. One thing I have noticed is the lack of acorns. Last year there was a bumper crop, and these fed squirrels and wood pigeons through the winter. That means the pigeons will be looking for something else to eat, so I'd better watch my oil-seed rape.

The wheat harvest was completed at the beginning of September. Yields were very good and prices are still excellent. We still have several hundred tonnes to dry and sell yet, but I should have more time this month to do this. Sowing next years winter wheat started soon after harvest finished. Wheat should ideally be sown from mid-September to mid-October to achieve optimum yields. The wheat will be sprayed with a herbicide to kill any grass and broadleaved weeds to stop them competing with the crop.

The potato harvest is almost finished. All the potatoes this year have been rather a hit and miss affair. Some crops have been excellent and easy to sell, and some have been full of rots and cracked ones, due to the wet weather in July.

Gordon Brown our senior staff member has recently completed 50 years service working for the Warburton Family. (I really must get round to paying him soon!!) The family presented him with an award on October 12. Geoff Warburton paid tribute to Gordon for his hard work and loyalty over the years and wished him continued good health and happiness for the future. The occasion was celebrated with champagne and a special cake. Gordon's family were invited and the local press covered the event. Question of the Month:

What is blue tongue disease and how is it affecting your farm?

I do not know why it is called blue tongue, as the animals do not get a blue tongue. The disease is spread by fleas and ticks biting and infecting animals, eventually causing their internal organs to fail. Blue tongue cannot be passed from animal to animal or animal to human so is no risk to us. DEFRA says the mild autumn has allowed the disease to spread from the continent where it has been rife for years. They say that cold weather will kill the fleas and midges and halt the spread of the disease. Nevertheless, a huge protection zone has been set up from the nearest outbreak at Peterborough reaching up to Congleton, and Crewe and Nantwich restricting the movement of livestock in and out of the zone. We are not directly affected at present.






