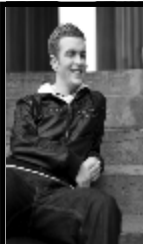
It all happens at the Kingsley Community Centre and is a joint Methodist /Anglican endeavour. At the service there will be a collection for the Children's Society. Please note the date!

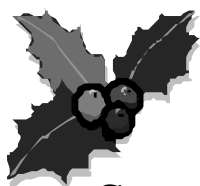

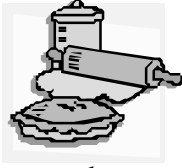
*At the Harvest Service on the 3rd October a number of St. Johns school children and their families attended. The hymns Autumn Days and Colours of the Rainbow were sung, as well as traditional church hymns. Some children talked about what the children of St. Johns school did on a special activity day. The final harvest was called the frugal harvest, in this activity the children thought about those countries whose crops failed and lit a candle for them. Mrs. Merrington, then told the people to write a prayer of thanks on the backs of some fruit shaped cards. These cards had words like hope, patience, generosity, peace and love on them. We then hung them up in a small version of the Jewish prayer shelter called a Sukkot, Mrs Merrington told us about sukkots and how the followers of God had slept in them. RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Yorkshire Parkin



8 oz treacle

4 oz brown sugar

6 tablespoons milk

$\frac{1}{4}$ level teaspoon bicarb of soda
ginger

4 oz lard

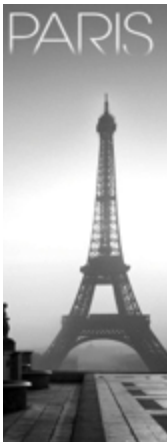
4oz plain flour

pinch of salt

8 oz medium oatmeal

1 heaped teaspoon ground gin-

Melt together the treacle, fat and sugar. Cool, add with the milk to the sieved flour, soda, oatmeal and ginger, and beat well. Pour into a 7-inch square gingerbread tin, brushed with melted lard, and bake in the middle of a moderate oven, 325°F, 170°C, gas mark 3 for 1 - 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ hours. Parkin is best kept in an airtight tin and eaten 2 or 3 days after baking.

KINGSLEY GARDEN CLUB

Jeff Hutchings of Laneside Alpine and Hardy Orchid Nursery is the biggest grower of hardy orchids in the country, and at our October meeting he quickly dispelled some of the myths and mysteries surrounding the growing in our gardens of these beautiful and often exotic looking plants.

He explained that there are a number of different species, none of which should be confused with indoor orchids, and that they can be grown in the open ground, in pots, cold frames or in cold greenhouses.

Some of course are easier to grow than others and it is logical that they can have different requirements depending on what their native habitat is. They also have different periods of dormancy so that their flowering times are different, but what is important to remember is that surprisingly they can be killed by too much TLC as both overfeeding and over protecting are not to their taste. Needless to say, our native orchids are obviously the best suited to our own growing conditions.

He stressed that it is important to make sure that they are obtained from a reputable nursery, and not dug up from the wild, and that paying a little extra in order to get a mature plant is very well worth while.

After this informative talk with the mouthwatering photographs, some of us who have never tried growing hardy orchids may now decide to have a go!

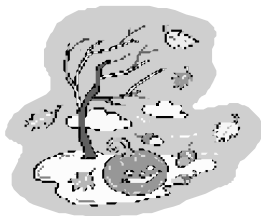

KINGSLEY WALKING GROUP

On the 29th of September 11 walkers, set off from the Salt Barge in Marsden, for a five mile walk. Initially along the Trent and Mersey Canal (a favourable route for some) which they crossed and entered Marbury Country Park, eventually reaching Budworth Mere, a haven for birds of all kinds.

After stopping for liquid refreshment (non alcoholic) they continued on their way collecting maps and heritage information from the rangers accommodation, which enabled them to pick out points of interest in this large area of woodland and lakes, which attracts large numbers of wildlife. Herons seemed to be particularly attracted, possibly because of the fish stocks in the mere.

At last they returned to the Inn and enjoyed an inexpensive repast, which, with the lack of rain and the reasonably warm weather, finished the Day on a high note.

On Tuesday, 12th, October a smaller than normal group of the Kingsley Walkers and a dog travelled to Willaston for a 7 mile walk under the guidance of Brian Russell.

From Hadlow Road Station by the Wirral Way the route followed a field path to Mill Lane and a succession of further paths to skirt the Eastern edge of Neston village before arriving on the shore of the River Dee at Denhall. The party had walked under an overcast sky but at Denhall the sun broke through. Lunch was taken on Denhall Quay the site of a former packet boat service to Ireland following the silting up of the Port of Chester, this however was short lived and Parkgate 2 miles west developed into a more used location. Denhall was also the site of a colliery open in the 17th century and closing in 1926. After lunch the party made their way via paths to the Wirral Way for the return route to parked cars at Willaston, to end an enjoyable outing.

Kingsley Walking Group have two walks each month, meeting at the Community Centre at 9.30am. On the second Tuesday there is a long walk, bring a packed lunch. 1. A Manchester man was arrested on Sunday afternoon for assaulting a Police Officer following reports of a drunken man near The Helsby Arms. The man was prosecuted and will appear in court next month.
2. We ran a traffic initiative in Helsby this week with 5 motorists being prosecuted for motoring offences.
3. We experienced a number of thefts of motorbikes at Oulton Park this week. Several high powered bikes were taken as well as some number plates.
4. Several residents in Cuddington reported receiving nuisance phone calls from a bank asking for personal details. I don't have the bank details but they did claim to be a bank from Northwich High Street. I would ask that you don't offer personal details to cold callers and contact the bank directly yourself.
5. Sightings please for a White vehicle with a number similar to RES 4 WK. This vehicle was seen in suspicious circumstances in both Kingsley and Newton.
6. I am grateful to the caller who reported a prowler in Sutton Weaver this week. Officers attended at 4am on Monday and found a former resident of Sutton Weaver drunk in the street. The man was wanted for a serious assault and subsequently arrested and charged and appeared at court on Tuesday.
7. I gave observations out two weeks ago for an Audi A 3 index number P 141 PLL whose occupants were responsible for thefts from shops in Frodsham. We have traced the driver of that vehicle and have prosecuted him for Theft.
8. Problems this week at Helsby Golf Club. Somebody has been entering the course at night and defecating in the bunkers and causing damage to the course. The name 'Gebends' has been written near to the bunkers as well and I would appeal to anyone who knows who this person is to contact us in the strictest confidence on the number above.
