# **Nature Notes from Delamere**

#### With Cheshire Wildlife Trust



We return to Delamere to discover how our rare white-faced darter dragonflies are getting on and to look at what's new in the Delamere Living Landscape.

## Delamere's Dragons

At Cheshire Wildlife Trust we're currently undertaking a reintroduction project in Delamere Forest, bringing back the white-faced darter dragonfly- last seen in Cheshire in 2003. In 2015, we carried out the second year of translocations- moving mature larvae from the donor sites in Staffordshire and Shropshire to the reintroduction site at Doolittle basin, Delamere. Despite colder weather, 150 larvae were successfully relocated to Delamere in time for their flight season, between May and July. The Delamere's Dragons team, led by Chris Meredith and supported by dedicated volunteers, has since been busy monitoring this rare and fragile species. This year we have seen white-faced darters emerging at the reintroduction site, as well as mature adults displaying breeding behaviour. Cheshire Wildlife Trust is hopeful that the future is bright for this iconic species.

#### What's next?

Next year could be a busy one for white-faced darters in Delamere. Eggs from the 2014 translocations should make their adult appearance. The project aims see a self-sustaining population in Delamere forest within the next 10 years.

With the busy summer survey season at an end the Delamere's Dragons team is excited for a winter of getting their hands dirty. Habitat restoration work will continue on new flight corridors. These flight corridors are vital for the sustainability of the white-faced darter and connect Doolittle with other suitable pools within Delamere. During this process some trees are removed which regenerates the natural heathland. These trees are used in charcoal making, creating a sustainable product and raising vital project funds.









### New trail for Hatchmere

Delamere Dairy is celebrating its 30th anniversary this year. Having started out three decades ago in Delamere with just a handful of goats, the company has gone from strength to strength. This year Delamere Dairy has returned to its roots and teamed up with Cheshire Wildlife Trust to help fund a new trail at the Hatchmere reserve.

Staff at Delamere Dairy, including owner Roger Sutton, got stuck in at Hatchmere helping to restore the pathway.

For the second month running, 24 people turned up for the short walk, on 30 September. This was a five miler starting from opposite Great Barrow church. We headed north along the ridge to the west of the village with views over open countyside, before dropping down by a narrow path through a field of maize to join the continuation of Firma Lane, then onto Broomhill Lane to head back to the village via Brook Farm and the Longster trail. 
