Kingsley Parish Council Meeting 18 October 2016

<u>Planning applications</u>. Two planning applications were received and discussed at the meeting.

<u>Playing Field</u> Kingsley Parish Council members tidied the playing field hedges and bushes and moved some young trees to a more suitable position. Two further pieces of mini gym equipment have been ordered. <u>Village Enhancements</u> Members of the Kingsley Parish Council spent time tidying the garden outside St John's school and planted the final tree and Mr & Mrs Tweedie kindly planted spring bulbs. Several benches are to be refurbished over the next few weeks and a few trees are to be planted on roadside verges. Cheshire West and Chester have been informed of the dead trees on Top Road.

<u>Highways</u> Town Farm Quarry is being monitored with regard to its activities and the number of lorry movements. Cheshire West and Chester have been consulted with regard to preventing parking outside the Cooperative Store which would include loading and unloading.

<u>Grasscutting.</u> Tender documents for 2017/2018 regarding grass cutting of the playing field, cemetery and foot paths will be available from the 1st of November.

Kingsley Walking Group



The September short walk began at Netherton Hall where we had our lunch after the walk. We headed up Carriage Drive and up the steps by Jacobs Ladder. One young man scrambling up the rocks before we crossed the golf course and zig zagged on paths and quiet lanes to Bradley. We followed a track to the river which we followed to Frodsham Bridge. Turning left we crossed Ellis Lane to a path up to Townfield Lane, eventually following Middle Walk on the hill and completing our circuit. Only twelve walkers today.

On 11 October, we struck new ground again, with a trip to The Wrekin in Shropshire, a prominence rising to 1337 ft, dominating the Shropshire plain. We parked in the grounds of a National Trust property, Sunnycroft, on the edge of Wellington to the north of The Wrekin. Passing under the M54 we soon entered woodland, gradually rising until we emerged to the final steep ascent. The weather was initially misty, but this largely cleared to give us distant views in all directions, though it was difficult to make out the individual hills to the south and west. Seven of us took the 8.5 mile walk. Another good day out!

Kingsley Walking Group have two walks each month: on the second Tuesday there is a long walk of 7 - 8.5 miles (bring a packed lunch); on the last Wednesday a short walk of approximately 5 miles with a coffee break and pub lunch. We meet at the Community Centre at 9.30am for the short walks and for the long walks in January and February. Note however an earlier start time of 9.00am for the long walks from March to November.
