<u>Playing Field</u> The wooden rocking dog play equipment is now fixed. We are still awaiting the platform for the junior climbing frame.

The perimeter hedges, particularly around the car park area, have become overgrown and will need cutting back, this to form part of the new Playing Field contract for 2018.

<u>Cemetery</u> Councillor Warburton to clarify details with the contractors on the quotes provided to repair the rail at the cemetery.

<u>General Assistant role</u> – A decision was made that the works undertaken by the previous GA would now be let as a work package to be tendered for 2018.

<u>Tenders</u> – Four grounds work packages are to be issued to competitive tender during early November .

<u>Highways</u> – Councillor Oultram to follow up with CWaC on the decision not to paint 'blips' on the kerbs on the cross. These were previously agreed to stop all parking on the bend, including dropping off.

<u>Townfield Quarry</u> A report was provided on the current position at the quarry. Recommendation that the three Parish Councils write a letter to the MPA expressing concerns and requesting for the issue to be opened up to further consultation before a decision is made.

<u>Website</u> – The Council is to commission a new website that will meet statutory requirements and provide public access to documents and other information. The council agreed to pursue the recommended provider from the report.

<u>Vacancies for new Councillors</u> – Interviews will be taking place on 7th November to appoint new Co-opted Councillors to the vacant positions from those people who have applied.

Remembrance Sunday – On 12th November, the Chairperson will lay a wreath at the war memorial in the cemetery, alongside other community groups. All invited.

<u>Christmas 2017</u> The Christmas tree for Hollow Lane is reserved, and work is underway to organise the Christmas lights at The Brow and at the Co-op on Hollow Lane.

This is yet another book with a twist, although, this time, it was clear that "something wasn't quite right" from the very beginning. Most of the group enjoyed it and thought that the twist really was unexpexted and well hidden. As ever, not everyone loved the book although, unusually, even the people who didn't like it read on to the end because they felt that they'd been drawn in to the story. Everyone agreed that it was an easy read.

The book scored an a average of 3.7 out of 5, a good score.

In November we will be talking about "Autumn" by Ali Smith. It was nominated for the Man Booker prize. (it didn't win) We will compare our thoughts with those of the judges. Ali Smith has split the group in the past and we expect a lively discussion at the meeting.

It's a mixed list, ranging from a Booker prize winner through to a first novel. We have a thriller, historical novel, war story and everything in between. 



Not already enjoying local shows? You really ought to get out more.

We start by featuring a December performance because not only is it being performed at the beginning of the month with a number of Kingsley Players involved, we have also received a lot of information about this from Harlequin Players. To précis, When We Are Married by J B Priestley is to be directed by KPs Malcolm Barker at The Harleguin Theatre, Northwich from Wednesday 6th to Saturday 9th and the cast includes KPs Neil and Lesley Silcock, Jake Powell and John Dodd (all in KPs Allo Allo), together with Fran and Ellie Hamer. They try to keep it secret but are hampered by an alcohol-soaked news photographer, keen to record the evening's events for posterity, and a wickedly destructive housekeeper who is hoping to use the couples' mortification to her own advantage. Kingsley Walking Group



Nine walkers completed the short walk in September, which started from The Walton Arms in Warrington. They walked along the Bridgewater Canal, through fields to Hill Cliff, then through a cutting which used to be the old Chester Road, it was here that they saw the old drinking trough hewn out of the rock. Through more fields towards Hatton and then towards Moore, where they rejoined the canal to walk back to the Walton Arms for a delicious lunch.

Six intrepid walkers tackled the Long Walk on October 10th in pleasant Autumn sunshine, having left Kingsley in the rain. The walk was seven and a half miles long and included a steep climb at the start to the site of Caradoc's (Celtic tribal chieftain) hill fort east of Church Stretton. The views from the summit were magnificent across to the Long Mynd, The Wrekin, North Shropshire, Apedale and Wenlock Edge. The walk then meandered down to the conservation village of Cardington where a picnic lunch was taken after some liquid refreshment at Shropshires oldest inn (Royal Oak). We then returned over the conical hills of Hope Bowdler and The Gaer Stone to our cars parked at Hazler Hill.

Kingsley Walking Group have two walks each month: on the second Tuesday there is a long walk of 7 - 8.5 miles (bring a packed lunch); on the last Wednesday a short walk of approximately 5 miles with a coffee break and pub lunch. We meet at the Community Centre at 9.30am for the short walks and for the long walks in January and February. Note however an earlier start time of 9.00am for the long walks from March to November.


