BEWARE - BEFORE YOU LIGHT YOUR BONFIRE

A remainder to all the kind folk of Kingsley to check, BEFORE lighting them, any bonfires that they have previously built during the warmer weather, in anticipation of 5th November, or bonfires they plan to build.

At this time of year many animals have gone into hibernation – crawling into these inviting warm dry piles of wood – certainly now the temperature has dropped. The unlit bonfires I have noticed around Kingsley – particularly along the nab, are an oasis for many animals and when these bonfires are finally lit they will claim many little lives in the most horrendous way. There are enough challenges already for our wildlife, the depleting hedgehog for one, who will have definitely set up home in an unlit bonfire. It wouldn't take long for the owners of these bonfires to reassemble/relocate the wood, or wait until the last minute to build them – they could recruit their audience an hour or two prior to lighting, to ensure these animals who have crawled or hopped in have a chance to escape.

5th to 8th December Harlequin Theatre, Northwich – *It's A Wonderful Life* adapted from the famous film by Mary Elliot Nelson and directed by Gordon Hamlin. If you

are one of the very few people who have not seen the famous James Stewart film, then briefly this is a great feel good story about George Bailey who has so many problems he is thinking about ending it all - and it's Christmas! As the angels discuss George, we see his life in flashback. As George is about to jump from a bridge, he ends up rescuing his guardian angel, Clarence - who then shows George what his town would have looked like if he had not have been born. REVIEWS

We do hope you were able to get to see KP's Pride and Prejudice last month. We understand it was just about a complete sellout and indeed on the night we attended there was not a spare seat to be had, The play was a great adaptation of the book with many funny moments and succeeded in capturing the storyline. Great performances by all cast both young and not so very young brought the story to life. But most credit has to go to director Kelly White who not only put the whole show together but due to illness of a cast member, two weeks before the show, she took over part of Elizabeth Bennet, the leading female character, and performed it so very well. If the information had not have been in the programme, we would not have known, And, how do they create a theatre structure and set of such quality with raised seating to boot in two days? Following on from that, we are advised that cast members are still active with Jake Powell (Mr Collins) directing *The Flint Street Nativity* in Frodsham and Malcolm Barker (Mr Bennet) appearing in *It's A Wonderful Life* at Harlequins.

Speaking of Harlequins, if you did not buy your tickets for Simon Jones' *Which Service Please* early then you would have been disappointed because the whole run was sold out a week before it opened. Local writer Simon also directed and played in this production which was so well done and presented by the Players. What a great night out and an evening of hilarity with everyone leaving the theatre with huge smiles. So best to book early to make sure of a place in next month's play.

At Tarvin Ashton Hayes Theatre Club did *Playhouse Creatures*, a great 17th century romp which brought both tears of laughter and sadness in this brilliantly directed play by Yvette Owen and the cast included KP's **Francis Hamer**. Hope you got to see that as well.

Kingsley Walking Group



We had a 5 mile walk on 26 September, from Little Budworth. From the Red Lion, we took field paths and tracks through woodland in a figure of eight, close to Oulton Park., in warm sunshine, followed by lunch at the pub.

On the 9 October there was a walk from Betws y Coed. of just over 8 miles. In fine weather, we set off alongside the river before climbing to higher, heather covered ground. Dropping down again to the river valley, through lovely woodland, we had lunch overlooking a narrow river gorge with water charging through. On the other side was a narrow boardwalk suspended on a sheer rockface, which we were glad not to have to cross. After passing by picturesque Llyn Elsi, we had a stiff climb, with views across Snowdonia, followed by a descent back to Betws, where we enjoyed a cup of tea together. Eight of us took the walk.

Kingsley Walking Group have two walks each month: on the second Tuesday there is a long walk of 7 - 8.5 miles (bring a packed lunch); on the last Wednesday a short walk of approximately 5 miles with a coffee break and pub lunch. We meet at the Community Centre at 9.30am for the short walks and for the long walks in January and February. Note however an earlier start time of 9.00am for the long walks from March to November.
