Next meeting 14th November 2019 at the Hurst Chapel at 7.30pm

At our last meeting we talked about "The Silent Companion" by Louise Purcell, which was described as a paranormal suspense book. The general consensus was that the book didn't really hit the mark. Interestingly, some people didn't read it because they avoid books that Gothic horror book which was the main marketing message. Basically, we agreed that this book was neither. We had an interesting conversation about marketing and "Top 100 award winning books". Generally we were left feeling sceptical.

In November we will be talking about Melmouth by Sarah Perry. We read "The Essex Serpent" some time ago and then went to see Sarah at the Gladstone Literary Festival when she was about to launch Melmouth last year. This book has had great critical reviews but is said to be "troubling". While it's in the style of a gothic historical novel, it is in a contemporary setting.

Kingsley Parish Council - November Update

You may recall our article in last month's Kingsley News with regards to the daffodil bulbs. We did in fact miss the submission date, but we have subsequently been informed by our Borough Councillor Hugo Deynem, that we have in fact been allocate 3 sacks of bulbs. We still await the delivery of these to the Parish Clerk at which point we will need to organise a planting work force from the schools, youth groups and villagers.

The Parish Council has stipulated that the areas of proposed planting must be agreed beforehand so any suggestions would be welcome. Possibilities may be; in the verges on the periphery of the village on say the Norley Road, Mill Lane, Top Road, etc; please let us know via Facebook or the Village Website. We are aware of a small number of residents who have expressed opposition to more bulb planting and we have taken note of your comments.

Another planting will take place soon by Frodsham Rotary Club, this time on the banking leading into the Kingsley Cemetery. The bulbs in question this time are Crocus bulbs. The cost of the bulbs and the planting of them is being undertaken by the Rotary Club themselves. We look forward in the growing gloom of winter, to a beautiful and colourful display in our verges in Kingsley in spring 2020.

You may also have seen our two new black planters at The Cross. These have been supplied and installed by CWAC, placed on paving slabs and filled with compost and a small bush. The two green planters that where at The Cross, have now been relocated to the bottom of Dark Lane and at the "Welcome to Kingsley" sign on Hollow Lane. The green planters will be planted up by the WI in the coming weeks / months, and we thank them for their kind offer to undertake this work.

Finally, the Parish Council would like to welcome two new Co-opted Councillors who were selected to join us at the October meeting. The first (in alphabetic order) is Stuart Begg who lives on Mill Lane and the second is Adam Currie who lives on Top Road, both have businesses in Kingsley Village. We welcome them both and look forward to working with them in the future.

Kingsley Garden Club - November 2019

The speaker for our second meeting of the season was by Ted Brabin, a very enthusiastic Liverpudlian ex-police officer (vice squad!) was ably assisted by his wife, who gave us an interesting talk on the flora of the Yunnan province in South West China. A province with snow capped peaks and bordering on Tibet and Laos. The main plant species were rhododendrons and many named after their discoverers who were Jesuit priests. It was interesting to note the plants grew on rocks with the barest of soil cover and minimal water in some cases.

The Committee would like to say a very big thank you once again to everyone who came along, especially to those new members who came for the first time. We had 29 people this time, and now have 37 full members which is good news, but there is still room for more. If you know anybody, or are someone who is interested in gardening and would like to increase your knowledge then please bring them along, or come along yourself, we are a friendly bunch - honestly. And there is free tea or coffee, and a biscuit at the end.

The "swaps" table is proving very popular, if you have anything garden related that you have too much of, don't need or is taking up too much room please bring it along. The only rule is; if it is not sold by the end of the evening please take it back home. All we ask is that you give a donation to the club as you see fit when you walk off with your item. This is NOT a sales table it is swap only. We have had plant pots, trays, plants, tools and even a scarifier!

Our speaker for next month is **Tim Carter on 11th November 2019**, **at 8pm**. Tim will be talking about **The Eden Project**, a project he was involved in the early days and in its construction.

Gardening Tips and Jobs to be done.....

- Rake up all those leaves off your lawns, do not leave them to rot on the lawn and ponds and put them on your beds or on a compost heap
- Make sure pots and containers are off the ground on some bricks so they can drain
- Plant your spring bulbs now (daffodils, tulips, etc) remember points of the bulbs pointing up.
- Give roses a prune to take off any large growth, especially standards, to stop the wind uprooting them, get it done before the frosts come.
- Insulate any large containers with bubble wrap and wrap in fleece any delicate plants such as olives, citrus.
- No more mowing of lawns! Top dress and spike the lawns then leave them, try not to walk on them over winter.
- Finally, please put out food for the birds, seeds, mealworms, fat balls and keep doing it throughout the winter. And don't forget fresh water and break it if it freezes.

Kingsley Walking Group - October Walks

The October Long Walk started from Prestbury and took 7 of us through some lovely countryside and across the National Trust Hare Hill estate. The sun shone and we finished back in Prestubury for afternoon tea and cake. We were delighted to welcome a number of our newer members back as well as some regulars.



The October short walk is scheduled to take place through Carey and Marbury Parks, alongside Neumann's Flash and a section of the Trent and Mersey Canal. We will have lunch at The Salt Barge Pub in Marston.

In November the long walk will be around Lyme Park, taking advantage of the new road which makes it quick and easy to get to. As ever, we plan to walk between 8 and 9 miles, meeting at Kingsley Community Centre at 9.00am.

We have booked our annual Christmas walk on December 10th. We will meet at the Community Centre at 10 and enjoy a local walk, ending at the Red Bull. Everyone is welcome, especially past members. If there is enough demand, we will organise a shorter and longer walk on the day. Give Vony a call if you'd like to join us.

Kingsley Walking group is an informal group that has been meeting for several years. Our monthly long walks on the second Tuesday of each month usually start up to 90 minutes drive away from Kingsley and would typically be between 7 - 8.5 miles (bring a packed lunch). Generally the long walks would be classified as "moderate". We have a leader for every walk who checks for stiles, distance, closed paths etc. New members and walk leaders are very welcome.

On the *last Wednesday of the month we have* a short walk of approximately 5 miles with a coffee break and pub lunch, these walks are leisurely. However, from January 2020 we plan to change the day of the short walk to the last Tuesday of the month. The October and November short walks will be on Wednesdays.

The next long walk will be on Tuesday November 12th, meeting at the Community Centre at 9am. The next short walk will be on Wednesday November 27th. In December we will have one walk on December 10th.

During the summer months we meet for our long walks at the Community Centre at 9.00am (9.30 in January and February). We aim to be back in Kingsley by about 6pm. 




