

#### **Frodsham and District History Society**

1982 saw the formation of Frodsham and District History Society and is a vibrant society with a growing membership and is nearing 100 today. The Society has a significant collection of Historic Documents and artefacts. The Collection includes

- Photographs of the Frodsham area from the 1800's
- Documents from the 1300's
- Books, Maps and artefacts .

These are currently stored in the Archives collection in Castle Park House.

Our aims are to promote the study of, and interest in, history and archaeology with particular reference to Frodsham and the surrounding district. It achieves this by holding monthly meetings, an annual trip and the production of an annual journal ,written and researched by members.

The society promotes the value of local history and heritage to the wider community through the placement of 30 Blue Plaques across Frodsham. We have recently formed a small group to work with the local council in updating and renewing the lectern boards throughout the town.

#### Meetings

Indoor meetings are normally held on the first Monday of the month at Main Street Community Church which has adequate parking.

This is the story of Aethelflaed, Lady of the Mercians who was the daughter of Alfred the Great .When her husband died she took over the reins of power and working with her brother Edward of Wessex she personally achieved military victories at Chester and Tattenhall .Her army stormed the Viking stronghold of Derby and forced Viking submission of Leicester. This is a story you won't want to miss.



#### Information about potential superfast fibre broadband for Kingsley

A meeting was held on 25<sup>th</sup> October at Crowton Village Hall to discuss the new full fibre broadband service which is planned for the area. In attendance were FACTCO (the provider) and Cheshire West and Chester Council. The aim is to bring ultrafast broadband connectivity to rural areas as part of the Department for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport's Project Gigabit. Here is a summary of what is involved.

#### How it works?

The Scheme is a form of Government funding which enables the infrastructure of a full fibre network to be built which will connect rural communities with a capacity of up to a Gigabit of data per second wherever possible.

Businesses and residents apply to have the broadband in their community upgraded and if the application is successful, the Government will give funding to companies like FACTCO to complete the build and install the network at no cost to the residents involved in the scheme.

The Vouchers that they give residents and businesses provide up to £1,500 per household and £3,500 for businesses to support the cost of the installation.

#### What is fibre broadband?

Most internet connections are run through copper wiring which was built over a hundred years ago to facilitate home telephones. This connection can only reach speeds of 300 Mbps.

Networks made from fibre cables allow for a much faster connection and will replace these copper cables. Fibre will provide a more secure and reliable broadband connection, reaching speeds of up to 1,000 Mbps.

#### Why the need for fibre?

After the UK analogue switch-off in 2025, you'll need fibre to access the internet and keep your home phone connected. Fibre will give you the ability to use the internet like never before.

With a fibre connection you can simultaneously work from home, stream movies, video call and shop online with ease.

#### I already have broadband so why the need for this?

Though your current connection may have been sold as fibre, it is likely that yours is the slower FTTC (Fibre to the Cabinet) kind. These dated networks only use fibre for parts of the connection. Slow copper cabling will be used across the network.

The network planned will be cutting-edge FTTP (Fibre to the Premises) connections. These connections use full fibre cabling across the entire network to ensure lightning-fast speed and reliability.

#### What are the costs?

Provided that the scheme has enough signed up then there will be no installation cost to those that have been approved for a voucher. There will however be monthly charges, like any other broadband contract.

#### What to do next

If you are interested in the possibility of being a part of this network, then you need to register your interest as soon as possible. To be viable the service requires a considerable proportion of local homes/businesses to register their interest.

#### **Kingsley Parish Council - October 2022**

The Parish Council met on the 6th October 2022, this was the first opportunity we were able to meet. The September meeting had to be postponed due to the death and mourning period for her late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. This prohibited local authorities from undertaking such meetings and prevented us publishing the summons to the meeting. We will be back to our third Tuesday of the month with our November meeting on 15th at 7pm.

Work to repair the damaged headstones in the cemetery will begin at the end of October, the Parish Council will be funding this work as our insurers appear reluctant to cover the cost. The works will re-pin, repair and securely refit any fallen elements back into place. Cracks or chips will be chemically bonded and repaired. Damaged headstones will not be replaced with new, if the grave owner requires replacement then this must be at the owner's own cost.

On Sunday the 2nd October, three Parish Councillors and their families, planted 46 shrubs and perennials in the slope at the end of the Co-op car park. We thank Kingsley Co-op for their generous donation to buy these plants, we are now looking forward to next Spring when we should hopefully see some blooms and growth.

Still on a horticultural theme, the Parish Council will once again be spreading wild flower seeds on the area of meadow created last year, as well as a new area to the right of the basketball area at the top of the playing field. In addition the, the Parish Council are working with CWAC's new initiative to bring back Community Orchards, and we are investigating a number of areas around Kingsley where an orchard ,or, orchards can be planted. Finally, the Parish Council have commissioned a report by CWAC's tree specialist into the condition of trees around the playing field, and will make known its findings in brief summary in Kingsley News when these are received .

The Parish Council have agreed to assist the Community Centre in the removal of a large quantity of weeds by agreeing to make available the large green waste bin in the cemetery for the disposal of the weeds. We are sure Kingsley residents will assist the Community Centre in the task of removing the weeds.

Two further projects that the Parish Council have agreed to support is; firstly the investigation by CWAC Highways team into the possibility of a speed reduction at the Guest Slack / Norley Rd / Top Rd / Delamere Rd junction; Secondly, we are working with CWAC and the Co-op in looking to provide a disabled access ramp between the Community Centre parking area and the Co-op car park. This will require the lease of land from CWAC and agreement from the Co-op for access to its car park. We will advise in due course on the outcome of both of these projects.

The weather held for the short (up to 5 miles) walk in September which started from the Boot Inn in Kelsall. This pub has a selection of six walking routes available on its website, good business I think to encourage walkers to stop by - thirsty and feeling justified in restocking on calories.

The Boot Inn also sells copies of Jen Darling's "Best Pub Walks in Cheshire", there are many such books eg "Circular Walks along the Sandstone Trail" by Carl Rogers (not the American psychologist) and a plethora of routes on websites such as the National Trust, AllTrails, GreatBritishlife. Still, it can seem a little intimidating to lead a walk for the first time, the meeting at the Community Centre, the organising of shared lifts, does everyone know how to get to the walk start, how long should I wait for any late arrivals, will there be enough parking space, are there any suitable toilet stops, what's the best place to stop for coffee or a packed lunch on the long walks? The list can seem endless but I have never known anyone to be unappreciative of the walk leader, whatever the weather and despite the occasional glitch or detour. The company is always good and areas near and further afield are discovered or rediscovered.

Coming back to the theme of the weather, September's long walk (up to 8 miles) was definitely moist, lovely paths led up from Colwyn Bay through woodland and views towards the Welsh hills and over Liverpool Bay. However, it was a fairly muddy lot that tramped into the seafront cafe at Porth Eiras, I can recommend their Welsh cakes and coffee as well as the wipe clean flooring.

The short walk in October (fine weather) was a fascinating one - close to Manchester Airport and passing through Quarry Bank Mill and along the River Bollin. More walks are planned for late October and November as well as a Christmas lunch at the Carriers Inn at Hatchmere, just watch out for the press gang signing people up to lead walks in 2023.
