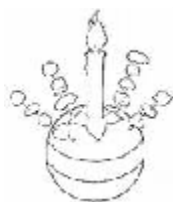

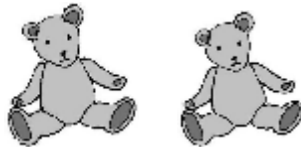
### Litter Pick Update

Dear Readers,

November has been a busy time in school with a varied programme of activities and events. . .

- Mrs Hill and Mrs Browne organised an informative South Africa Evening to share their experiences of their recent visit to our Partner School in Soweto with staff, Governors, Friends of the School, parents and Local Authority Personnel. Mrs Sibiya, the Head teacher of the school wanted to express her thanks to members of the Parish and the school who generously donated funds to support the school. On their visit, Kingsley St. John's staff taught across the school in average class sizes of 55 sharing work on Literacy, Music, and PSHCE. They also recorded first hand accounts of life in the apartheid era, collected African folk tales to share with the children and took lots of photographs!
- Lower juniors had an exciting visit to Tatton Park Old Hall, dressing up as Tudors and had tried their hand at making wattle and daub, spinning wool and weaving, making flour, being put in the stocks and exploring the grounds They decided they would rather remain in the modern world!
- Upper juniors had a thought provoking session from the Gripping Yarns theatre company organised by the Local Authority looking at the need to be Internet aware. The children had the opportunity to watch a play and then take part in some workshops to make them more aware of Internet Safety.
- Upper juniors also enjoyed an informative Science Workshop from Helsby High School staff on Forces.

## CRUMBALL RALLEY 2008

We would like to thank all those who donated generously to our cause and everybody who followed our adventure through Europe. We've have been asked to write a brief account in our part of the Crumball Rally 2008; Ok here goes;

We're not convinced any one of us had a master plan, what we had was very simple, an old mini bus with lots of rust, a shoe string budget, a change of underwear, a few times and locations, and our passports; where to stop at night – who knows, work it out when we get there!

Our ferry crossing was booked for 5am Thursday, now knowing how slow the mini bus travels we decided to set off early Wednesday evening. We had our fan fair send off, music, streamers, tears from loved ones and James trying his best to wheel spin the bus.

Getting to Dover was a lengthy task, about 9 hours with numerous stops along the way, I think buying some shares in Costa Coffee could be a shrewd move!

Mark (who came for the experience) had never been out of the UK, so he had a shiny new passport, and was eager to use it and have it stamped, but how disappointed he was when at passport control, the man said are you British, to which we replied 'Yes', Ok then off you go! How gutted Mark was for not having to show it, James and I explained to him that he will need it to get back in the UK, that made him feel much better!

The ferry crossing was an early one and took about an hour, any flat surface had a body sleeping on it. We eventually found some unoccupied seats to get some sleep only if it was for 15 minutes.

We entered France on a cold and gloomy morning, but again Mark was waving his passport at the guard as if he had the winning lottery ticket, I got the impression from the guard that he did not want to be there, so we got waved on. Now we had to keep reminding ourselves that in this country they drive on the wrong side of the road! Only had a few near misses.

Feeling a little deprived of sleep at this point, so the immediate thought was to find a campsite. We found an odd site just outside of Boulogne. The owner did not speak a word of English and between the three of us the extent of our French vocabulary stretched to about three words – 'Hello', 'Goodbye' and 'Wine', so with the power of international English, speak slower and louder,



passed a few Euros across the palm of the owner, we then had a plot to park the bus for the night.

Friday was the big day and having slightly overslept we made it to the registration point with minutes to spare. The sight before us was like a shot from the Wacky Races! Cars resurrected from generations gone by, all restored to make them look worse! Spent a few moments mingling with other fellow crumblers, the mini bus received a lot of attention. Today's mission was to somehow get from Boulogne to Besancon. As we had a budget of 'not a lot' the decision was made not to use toll roads. Driving through France with out any fast or direct roads, you get to understand how large it is. While most other crumblers took about 5 hours to reach the check point, we on the other hand took about 10 hours, but we saw vast amounts of France. Seeing many war memorials and cemeteries along the way, gave us time to reflect our thoughts to what happened in the area where we stood.

We finally reached Besancon for about 10pm a further hour and a half to locate a campsite, only to find the gates are locked at ten, Ok lets think of plan B. We found a lay-by that looked 'safe' this one had a few truckers and local people doing what local people do in lay-byes late at night. But the three of us had a good night cooking food and a glass of wine while watching the goings on!

The following day we awoke to lots of rain, but it was not enough to put out our spirits. Today's mission was to meet at an unexpected supermarket car park dressed as an Italian gangster. We got many odd looks from the locals, its not every day you nip down to the local shop to find 200+ people dressed as gangsters hanging around. Once we had received the days task, we made our way to Turin via the Grand St. Bernard's Pass. We have to say this was an awesome day, things we saw and did will stay with us, and make us smile for the rest of our lives. The immenseness and views driving though the Alps can be only be described as breath taking, Lake Geneva just stunning. We reached Turin in good time and found a campsite parked on a hill over looking the city. Once again we had to use international English with the campsite owner. We were all looking forward to a night out in Turin. We were ready for anything! We met up with some other crumblers on the way into town; a good night was had by all!

Day three of the rally took us from the Italian city of Turin over the Alps, drop into France, drive through Monaco, go for a spin round the Grand Prix circuit and end the rally in Nice, then consume some good food and wash it down with the not so finest French wine! This plan went like clockwork, other than we missed that last train back from Nice to our campsite, so a bit of bartering took place with a taxi driver; we got the price down.

The final three days we spent exploring the south coast of France, we found several places to camp, sunbath, swim and general relaxation before the mammoth drive back north. We allowed about 24 hours to drive the mini bus from the south coast to the north coast of France, we made it with about 4 hours to spare.

Next year we are looking to complete the rally in an Ice Cream Van, so if anyone knows of one going spare then please let us know. Once again I would like to thank you all for your support.
