News Bulletin

Western Rural Round-up -

Week Commencing 1st November 2010 NPT Voicemail- 0845-458-6393

- 1. We have received several reports of crimes occurring around Howey Lane Frodsham and prowlers being disturbed in Howey Rise. A resident disturbed a youth in dark clothing on the roof of his garage this week and he made off. In Howey Lane we had a large value of mountain bikes stolen from a property.
- 2. Reports of egg throwing in Kingsley on the lead up to Halloween. All I need is the names please and we will do the rest.
- 3. We received a report of a robbery this week at the Petrol Station in Helsby. A masked man stole cash from the till and made good his escape. Lots of ongoing enquiries on this one, but if anyone has information regarding it please contact us.
- 4. We assisted the Fire Service with two days of driver engagement in Helsby. This is intended to educate drivers who speed about the effects of their speeding. A large number of people were caught speeding over two days and if they did not engage in the programme, then they were given a speeding ticket.
- 5. Reports of prowlers on bicycles in Kingsley over the past week. On one occasion they broke into a garage and stole bottles of Champagne. The only description is a youth 18-20yrs. This is likely to be a local youth so if you hear of anyone selling Champagne please let me know as they are identifiable.
- 6. A White Transit Van with a number similar to w 741 DOC was seen acting suspiciously in Tarporley this week by a member of the public. He felt that the occupants were eyeing up houses. Can I request sightings please.
- 7. A Helsby man was arrested by Special Constables over the weekend in Bellemonte Rd Frodsham after being found in possession of cannabis. He has been interviewed and a substantial amount of cannabis plants were seized at his Helsby address.
- 8. A very busy Halloween with sadly lots of incidents of egg throwing especially around Frodsham, Helsby and Tarporley. I had extra patrols on duty over the weekend and was able to cope with the added demand. I have extra officers on duty this weekend to deal with the Bonfire issues and I will be deploying both uniformed and plain clothes officers to deal with any incidents

Trading Standards - Doorstep Crime & General Scams Update October 2010

This month we have received 13 reported Doorstep Incidents and through intervention and advice have saved residents over £1100

Reports include:

- Companies telephoning offering free home security systems in the Chester, Northwich and Winsford areas. Please note "free" systems often come with high maintenance and monitoring costs.
- Cold calling at elderly residents' property in the Hartford, Northwich area offering roofing repair work.
- Cold calling in the Kingsley area offering to supply and fit fascia boards and guttering.
- An individual cold calling in Upton, Chester offering double glazing and claiming to be working for the Council, please note the Council does not approve or recommend third parties.
- Cold calling in the Little Neston area for roof coating work, residents reported that the trader was persistent and in one incident removed tiles from the roof without permission, they were later replaced when the Police were called.
- Utility companies cold calling in the Chester area using high pressure sales tactics to encourage residents to change suppliers

Cheshire West & Chester Trading Standards Department advises residents to crack down on Doorstep Crime and say no every time. Say no to all cold callers, if you require work to be carried out seek recommendations from friends and family and obtain 2 – 3 written quotes.

Did you know?

If you agree to work at your home for over £35 with very few exceptions you must be given a 7 day cancellation period. If the notice of the right to cancel is not provided this is a criminal offence and also renders the contract unenforceable.

Current Scams

- Portuguese lottery scam letter claiming you are a winner. If you haven't entered you cannot have won!
- Clothing collections remember a registered company number is different to a registered charity number, charities can be verified by contacting the Charities Commission on 0845 300 0218. If in doubt always give to a local charity shop.
- Computer repair scam caller purporting to be from Microsoft and charging customers a fee to check for viruses, not only are you paying for something you don't need but you are also giving scammers access to your computer. Never give out personal details over the phone.
- Take that tickets bogus websites only buy from authorised ticket agencies, according to the national press official agencies are listed at www.gigsandtours.com/gat/ticketagencies.html
- Sky warranty scam Company telephoning giving the impression they are
 calling from Sky with an extended warranty, the caller later finds out that
 the company is not Sky but a third party. Ask for the identity of the
 company and caller, do not give personal details over the phone, if it is a
 product or service that you want then call the number that you know as
 being genuine to make further enquiries.

To report a Doorstep Incident please contact Consumer Direct on 08454 04 05 06 where the matter will be referred to your local Trading Standards Service.

Cheshire West & Chester Trading Standards provide a rapid response to doorstep incidents where appropriate (Mon – Fri 09.00 – 17.00) Outside of these hours please contact Cheshire Police on 0845 458 0000 or in an emergency dial 999.

To report a scam please contact Consumer Direct on 08454 04 05 06 where advice will be provided and where appropriate the matter referred to your local Trading Standards Service and other partner agencies for investigation.

This month, I hope you enjoy reading about what our older children have been studying linked to their work in science.



On the 3rd of November 2010 class 3 went to the Catalyst Museum in Widnes. When we got there we were given some booklets and told to go up a floor to the birth of an industry............. 

Kingsley's Affordable Housing – Progress

We finally have some positive news about Kingsley's affordable housing development.

In the middle of March, the development was granted planning permission, following a lot of work to make sure that the houses would be allocated to people with a strong Kingsley connection. The next step was to secure funding from Cheshire West & Chester and Central Government. So we had to wait for the outcome of the spending review.

Finally, we heard that our scheme is one of very few to go ahead and that all the necessary funding is now in place. At the moment everything is being finalised so that building work can begin before Christmas.

The houses will be managed by Plus Dane Housing Association and built by McInerney Homes ,who have recently completed a similar development in Tattenhall. The homes will be built to the Code for Sustainable Homes, level 4 which is a high environmental standard.

Applications for the houses will not be accepted until they are nearing completion. In the January newsletter we should be in a position to publish the plans for selling and renting the homes. The timescale for completing the build will also be published then but, realistically, this is unlikely to be before November 2011.

The Parish Plan – Update

The Parish Plan project is now well underway. The idea behind the project is to develop a long term plan for Kingsley which is based on the views of people living in the village. To be successful, we need to show that we have involved everyone in the community in generating issues to be considered and agreeing priorities.

The project will go through a number of stages over the next 12 months. They are as follows:

- 1) To identify a wide range of issues that the Plan may address. These include environmental, community, traffic and transport, housing etc.
- 2) To conduct a survey of Kingsley residents using the issues identified.
- 3) The results will be analysed and priorities for the Kingsley Plan will be established.
- 4) Working groups will generate plans for each of the areas identified. These will be consolidated into a Plan for Kingsley.

We will need help with each stage in the project and everyone is welcome to do as much or as little as they choose.

So far we have had a brainstorming session to generate ideas. There will be similar sessions throughout the village, so if you didn't get a chance to attend the first one, you still have a chance to be heard. Alternatively, you can send any issues or ideas to me and I'll be sure to incorporate them in the next part of the project. Keep an eye out for news of the next meeting in January. It will be in the Kingsley News, on the Notice Boards and on our website.

Kingsley, Crowton and Norley Mothers' Union

Mrs Jeanette Appleton, M.U. Members' Representative for York Province, was the speaker at our November meeting, talking about 'Round the World in over 78 Countries'. She described the various kinds of work done there and showed how they respond to the different needs of the countries. She illustrated the talk with colourful pictures and a film of the workers in the more remote parts of these countries. Mrs Appleton also told us of the latest M.U. campaign 'Bye, Buy Childhood' aimed at tackling exploitation of children through inappropriate advertising and selling. Childhood has become a marketing opportunity worth £99 billion in the U.K. and £350 million is spent in the U.K. each year on persuading children to 'consume'. December is the time when thieves become more active. They can come in various forms from burglars, cold calling and scams.

Your local officers who are responsible for Frodsham and Kingsley are PC Terry Cawley, PCSO James Mclaughlin and PCSO Kay Swindlehurst all who work from Frodsham Police station. **Tel 01244 61 2543.** This is a direct number to Frodsham Police station but may not always get answered.

For urgent calls you should ring 999 only in an emergency for crimes in progress ,crimes which have just occurred and the suspect is in the vicinity, serious road traffic accidents, danger to life and concern for vulnerable persons.

Non 999 calls are **0845 458 0000** this is for non urgent calls relating to queries, property queries and crimes after they have been discovered (and the suspect is NOT thought to be in the vicinity). Basically anything of a NON URGENT nature. They will not mind if it turns out to be a false call, it is better for the community to be safe rather than saying "if only".

In general at this time of year criminals are aware that homes have valuables in them at the run up to Christmas. residents should be extra vigilant and report anything they feel is out of the ordinary i.e. strangers going from door to door (always ask for id) and vehicles driving up and down that look suspicious. Keep all valuables out of sight especially car keys that can be seen from your window or front door and remember to keep your home secure and when out for the evening ensure that some lights are left on. A house in darkness is usually a good sign that no one is home!!

SCAMS, we are getting a lot of reports of "cold calling scams"

whereby a company calls you and explains that maybe you have money to claim or you have won a prize. These scammers usually ask for an UPFRONT PAYMENT to ensure that you get your prize. Please do not provide any company or individual with your personal details or bank details or monies.

If in doubt politely hang up. If the calls persist please call that Police on the 0845 number. REMEMBER " if it sounds too good to be true, it probably is "

Speeding issues, we are actively requesting that your local residents advise the Police on roads that you feel require some Police attention due to vehicles constantly travelling in excess of the speed limit. If your residents could think about any roads that may require some attention please feel free to call me and we will look into the matter with regards to some Police speeding campaigns.

Ring the number below right away, At this time of year many elderly and vulnerable people are at risk due to cold weather. Keep an eye on them and for those of you who are going away, let a close neighbour know.
