The following information has been received from Trading Standards.

Trading Standards Warning : Mobile phone delivery scam

We are advising all residents to be aware of this scam if you receive a delivery of a mobile phone that you have not ordered. The scammers will order a mobile phone in your name and when it is delivered to you, you will receive a call saying there has been a mistake and the goods will be collected by courier. The scammer will then call to collect the phone from you, pretending that they are a courier. The scammers get to keep the phone whilst the bill will remain in your name. If you suddenly receive delivery of goods addressed to you or somebody else in your household that you know you have not ordered contact the sender immediately.

Have a very happy Christmas and best wishes for a happy new year to everyone.



Litter Pick Update





Merry Christmas from Hong Kong Kati Kang

The first English sentences I ever learned were: Long live Chairman Mao; Long live the Communist Party and Merry Christmas! We had to learn these three sentences even before starting to learn the English alphabet, we learned them the same way we learned the Chinese characters, by writing them hundreds of times and learning them by heart, it didn't matter whether we could understand or not. The first two sentences are easy to understand, but even our teacher had no clue what Christmas was about. 35 years ago in Manchuria, in the north of China where I grew up, Christmas was an exotic and alien thing to us. No one knew what it was all about.

At the end of the 1980's, one Christmas Eve in Beijing, a schoolmate asked me whether I wanted to go to a church with him, he had heard that church was open to the public and he wanted to know what was so secret inside. I had never been inside a church in my life before, although there was a church by the river in my hometown, but it was always locked and remained a secret. (Just one month ago I discovered that church was built by the Irish Presbyterian Church in the mid-19th century). I always felt curious about that beautiful, impressive building every time I passed it by. It was so dignified and instantly made me feel calm when I saw it. It was so different to the feeling going into any of the Chinese temples where are always full of people with miserable and anxious faces, plus the noise and the smoke from the thousands of burning incense sticks..... the clamor was irritating and exhausting. Occasionally the monks walked around looking most unhygienic which disgusted me and made me depressed for the religion they represented. We were educated by our Government that religions (especial Western religions) were evil and a pollution of the spirit. But how they were evil or why they could pollute our spirit, was never explained and we had no idea!

When I found out that many of the hospitals, schools and Western medical colleges in Manchuria were funded and built by Western churches more than a hundred years ago, and that they have saved hundreds and thousands lives, I felt terribly disturbed and upset by my earlier education, all the nasty accusations about Western religions were such nonsense. I might not believe in God, but I certainly did not trust anything the Communist Party said.

The church is located in the center of Beijing; it took us about an hour to get there by bicycle from our University. I remember so clearly even today my first impression of the church's interior was so serene, even when full of people, it seemed designed to make people think more deeply about life, about everything. Unfortunately, I didn't see anything for celebrating Christmas that evening, maybe I didn't know how I should celebrate it anyway. It was the first

time it was open to the public, a lot of people like us just wanted to know what a Western church looked like inside. All I heard were lot of people arguing about whether God existed. I felt confused and amused by people who suspected there is no God when they are in a church!

In 1990 I left China, and had my first real Christmas holiday in Sweden. I helped my friends decorate their Christmas tree, it was my first time, later I was told by my friend that no one in the family had ever seen such poorly decorated Christmas tree!

Living in Hong Kong for so many years, I have become used to seeing and enjoying all the beautiful lights around Victoria Harbor at Christmas time. Friends exchange presents, but Christmas in this part of the world is more for commercial purposes, not for family gatherings, it's not such big deal if someone fails to turn up at the dinner table. Chinese New Year is the real family holiday and family members especially the elderly treat it very seriously. Children are always happy for holidays no matter in which culture. But one thing is different between Chinese and Western children. Western children receive presents from their family at Christmas and Chinese children receive Hong-Bao (red paper envelopes with cash inside). That's why you should not be surprised if a Chinese child tells you that his or her aim in life is "To make a lot of money"!

I wish Kingsley a very Merry Christmas and Happy New Year

THE FIRST SURGERY IN KINGSLEY

The Knoll Surgery had its beginnings in the village at the home of my paternal grandparents William and Mary Eaton on the Norley Road . In those days a visit to the Doctor meant that something was not treatable at home with senna pods or some other curative potion or lotion.

Visiting patients had to wait on the roadside.......often pouring with rain and bitter cold. Doctor James would be late but forgiven because everyone knew his time would have been spent visiting other housebound patients and unstintingly giving his time to them.

We all had to pay to see the Dr. then but if anyone was really too poor Dr. James did not charge. He was well respected for his kindness and genuine concern for his patients.

The Surgery building itself was probably what was known as the wash-house. Attached in this case with access up a small path from the road. Whitewashed, a tile floor and of course spotlessly clean. The only furniture was a wooden bench along one wall, a large desk under the window opposite and a bosuns chair for the Dr to sit in. Patients sat on the bench facing him and the window.

Doctor Norman Dickenson took over from Dr. James and held the main Surgery at The Knoll in Frodsham where he also lived. He continued with the Kingsley Surgery on the Norley Road which, on the demise of Mr and Mrs Eaton was occupied by their daughter and her husband Mr and Mrs Jack Goodier. Doctor Geoffrey Dickenson then joined his father in the Practice.

The Kingsley Surgery was then held at the home of .Mr Tom Littlemore and his sister Mary on The .Cross in the heart of the village. Miss Mary continued for many years until taken over by next door neighbour Mrs Marjorie Houghton. The Surgery then being moved to one of the old cottages, converted for the purpose at the bottom of The Hurst. This was run by Mrs Houghton until her retirement.

The Knoll Medical Practice has now moved to a custom built large Clinic in Princes Way Frodsham, it cares for 12000 patients and a team of fifteen Doctors headed by Doctor Patrick Milroy. The Kingsley Surgery is still held at the Brookside cottage at the bottom of The Hurst.

Before 1919 my mother Mrs Laura Eaton rented the cottage to introduce newspapers into the village .






