<u>Middle Lane Playing Field</u> - The possible asset transfer of the Middle Lane playing field has resulted in further questions being posed to Cwac.

Data Controller Registration has been renewed with the ICO.

Playing Field

· Funding – The decision on the grant funding is expected in early December.

• Kingsley Carnival – As it unlikely that the previously proposed working group will mobilise, it was agreed that pending successful funding approval, it might be possible to hold a mini event to celebrate the completion of the playing field improvements. This would involve local groups and be done in conjunction with the 'Fields in Trust' charity.

• Frodsham and District Round Table - The Chairman indicated that Frodsham and District Round Table may have funding available for local projects and that we should consider applying to help with the playing field improvements.

Traffic/Transport - Councillor Vickers attended a meeting with representatives of Kingsley Community Primary School, CWAC and the PCSO. The resulting action is for KPC to request CWaC undertake the assessment as highlighted in Councillor Vickers report but that it should cover the entire length of Hollow Lane through to Mill Lane and that the scope of the assessment should also include the likely impacts of the potential increase in HGV movements through the village, should permission to extend the Town Farm quarry working be granted.

Community Centre Parking Plan - Councillor Pownall has engaged a local architect (at no charge) to consider reconfiguring the space around the Community Centre to increase the number of parking spaces, which in turn might alleviate some Hollow Lane traffic/parking issues. Initially this appears positive, and the architect advised that a topographical survey would be needed. Councillor Pownall has obtained a quote of £395+VAT for this work which the Council has agreed to commission.

Town Quarry - Councillor Pownall to ensure that key points arising from the recent meeting with PINS are communicated to the village.

<u>Christmas Lights</u> - Councillor Moores has arranged for the erection and decoration of the tree prior to the lights switch on on 3rd December. The children from Messy Church will attend, and refreshments are being organised by The Red Bull PH as in previous years.

<u>Tree Replacement</u> - Councillor Cliff has a proposal for the replacement of some of the roadside trees which have died or been felled in recent years.

<u>Clerk Vacancy</u> - A number of applications were received; these were shortlisted for interview on Friday 20th November. The KPC Personnel Committee have authority to appoint the new Clerk following the interviews.

FARM UPDATE - WINTER - NOVEMBER 2015

NEWS & VIEWS FROM YOUR LOCAL FAMILY FARM

Firstly, many apologies for there not being any Farm Update for some time. It has been a very busy summer, both on and off the farm.

We started harvesting our early potatoes on 6th May this year. This is as early as we have ever started, and surprising because we had such a cold wet spring. After last year's disastrous potato harvest, when big yields and potato blight caused the price to crash early in the year (and never recovered), we needed a good start this year. The price at our farm shop remained stable for quite a while. The cold spring followed by a dry May delayed potato development. Big yields are no good in early potatoes, because everyone wants small sweet new potatoes.

The chipping potato harvest started at the beginning of July. These are varieties of potatoes specifically grown for chip shops. Chip shops want large oval potatoes with low water content – unlike the 'early' varieties. Demand was good from the start and with no potato blight this year, quality was excellent. It has been a pleasure to harvest them.

Trivia of the week: Potatoes are the only produce for which there is a statutory requirement that retailers identify the variety. Labels marked 'Whites' or 'Reds', although common, has been illegal for decades.

The cereal harvest started later this year. We started the winter barley at the end of July. Yields were good, but a strong pound and good harvests all around the world this year causing a surplus of grains has meant the price is really low. Even the war in Ukraine has not had an impact on prices. Ukraine is the main wheat producer for that area, and is Russia's main exporting port for their wheat. Apparently there is a large "EL NINO" effect this year, so we will see if this has any effect.

Our wheat harvest started mid August with our Milling Wheat. This yielded well and was the best quality we have ever grown. It commanded a premium price over standard feed wheat, so we must be doing something right. The feed wheat harvest continued between the showers. Whoever said that "Britain has the best climate for growing crops and the worst for harvesting them" was correct. Yields again were good, but the price is poor. Wheat prices have dropped about 50% over the last five years.

During July we were approached by a land agent representing Tesla, who wanted us to agree to let them conduct a seismic survey across our Frodsham Farm. This involved driving across all our fields, through crops that were almost ready for harvest, to drill small holes every 30m and place an explosive charge down in the ground. When these were detonated, the resulting echo

would bounce back off the rocks underneath to enable them to see what type of rocks were there and their general layout. This would tell them if the rocks would contain any shale gas that they might be able to extract. I immediately thought of "The Beverley Hill Billies", the old TV show where the local farmers in America hit oil under their land and became millionaires overnight. My enthusiasm was soon dashed though, when I learned that any gas found under our fields belong to IGAS – the company that has been awarded the licence to conduct the survey. The only way the landowner could make any money from this would be if the drill head was situated on our land. This is highly unlikely. I despair at the amount of mis-information, nonsense and scaremongering that has been on Social Media about this.

At the end of September we were honoured to host the Cheshire Ploughing and Hedgecutting match at Frodsham, organised by The Cheshire Ploughing and Hedgecutting Society. This event is held every year somewhere in the County, and is like a small agricultural show. We were due to host it in 2012 but due to torrential rain for weeks beforehand, it had to be cancelled at the last minute. This year was totally different with glorious sunshine all week. There was 140 trade stands selling everything connected with farming and agriculture. There was over 100 tractor plough men, horse plough men/women, hedge layers and hedge cutters in dozens of classes spread over 100 acres, all competing to be best in their class. We had around 3500 people attending, and over 1000 competitors, stewards, stall holders etc. The National Vice President of the NFU Guy Smith was present, and a very successful day was had by all. Although we do not get paid for the event, the Society gave us £1000 to donate to a charity of our choice. Our nominated charity was the Motor Neurone Disease Association in memory of my father Lionel who died of this debilitating condition in 1994.






