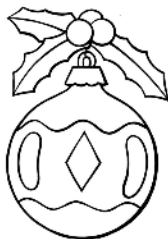

This month we talked about “When I Found You” by Catherine Ryan Hyde. We had a lively and interesting discussion. We were delighted to welcome new members who have just moved to the village.

Our final book for 2018 is “Snap” by Belinda Baur (Crime novel, *Sunday Times* bestseller, longlisted for the Man Booker Prize for Fiction 2018). It’s a good read, and will keep you guessing to the end. If, like a number of other people who have been reading along with us, our 2019 list is on our Facebook page or get in touch and I’ll send you a copy.

At our last meeting of 2018 we will also be taking a few minutes to reflect on the books we’ve read over the year. These have ranged from Restoration (period novel, funny) to *The Anatomy of a Soldier* (a story told from a very different perspective), *The Heart Goes Last* (quite a different novel by Margaret Atwood) and *Eleanor Oliphant is Completely Fine* (our favorite). We’ve also attended Weaver Words, *The Tempest* at Grosvenor Park, Gladfest to hear Sarah Perry (author of the Essex serpent, a favorite novel last year) and the Poetry Pub Crawl as part of the Storyhouse literary festival.

Kingsley Walking Group



This year the Kingsley Walking Group will be having their Christmas walk and lunch at the Red Bull on Tuesday 11th December. There will be a walk available for everyone, including a pleasant amble, a short walk (roughly 3 miles) and a longer walk (roughly 5 miles). All the walks will start and end at the Red Bull. The short and long walkers will leave the Red Bull at 9.30 and the "ambling" group will leave at 11.00. Lunch will be at 1pm.

Everyone is welcome, especially members who haven't been able to join us for a while. The cost is £17.95 for 2 courses and £21.95 for 3 courses. If you'd like to join us, please email KingsleywalkersWA6@gmail.com or call 01928 78909 for details and a menu.

On 31 October, there was a five mile walk from Lymm. From the centre of Lymm we skirted the edge of the golf course to enter a wooded area with several ponds. We crossed to a track alongside the Manchester Ship Canal, which took us under the Thelwall viaduct, with its thunderous traffic. Continuing, we arrived at the Thelwall Ferry, which has operated since the Canal was constructed. From this peaceful spot we walked through the ancient village of Thelwall, before returning to Lymm via a picturesque stretch of the Bridgewater canal, and lunch at the Spreadingale pub. Ten of us enjoyed the walk, on a pleasant sunny day.

On 13th November there was an 8.5 mile walk starting from Caldy. Nine of us walked along the shoreline past West Kirkby towards Hilbre Point, where we had our morning coffee in glorious sunshine. We left the beach, passing through Hoylake and then across the fields seeing kestrels and other wildlife. Our walk took us past a fishing lakes, Royden Hall and then through Stapledon Wood back to Caldy.

Kingsley Walking Group have two walks each month: on the second Tuesday there is a long walk of 7 - 8.5 miles (bring a packed lunch); on the last Wednesday a short walk of approximately 5 miles with a coffee break and pub lunch. We meet at the Community Centre at 9.30am for the short walks and for the long walks in January and February. Note however an earlier start time of 9.00am for the long walks from March to November.

Kingsley Garden Club

The November meeting of the Garden Club was attended by twenty eight people to hear a very enthusiastic and passionate presentation from Anthony Norman of Conquest Plants, a nursery based in Macclesfield. Anthony's talk was entitled Autumn & Winter Plants, and showed the wide variety of plants that we can use in our gardens for colour and structure from September through to March. As Anthony demonstrated there is no need to have a "dead" garden over winter, many trees and shrubs (and even bulbs) can give us both colour from foliage, berries and bark, and structure that brings interest over the dull and cold days of winter. Anthony brought a large selection of plants which members were able to purchase after the talk.

There will be no meeting now until February 2019, as the committee decided that due to the very poor attendances in recent years at the January meeting generally as a result of the weather, it would be better to remove this from the programme.

On 11th February 2019, George Pilkington will be giving us a talk on Wildlife Gardening. George is a well respected naturalist and has written many books and works as advisor to many national bodies.

Gardening Tips and Jobs to be done....

- Rake fallen leaves off your lawns onto borders, this will act as a mulch for plants
- Ensure all tree stakes and ties are in place to stop rocking of plants during the winter gales.
- Don't tidy your gardens too much, leave seed heads for birds and vegetation for small mammals and wildlife to shelter in.
- Protect tender plants such as olives and Bay with fleece over the foliage and bubble wrap on the pots.
- Put an insulated cover over your garden taps, or better still turn them off and drain the pipework.

May we wish all our members a very Peaceful and Happy Christmas and a Happy New Year. We look forward to seeing you all again in 2019, and to welcoming many more new members to the club.

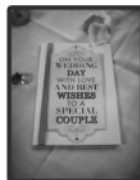
