KINGSLEY WALKERS

What was that I was saying about the weather in the last issue? The rains have certainly arrived now but Kingsley's finest continue doughtily, out and about and stirring up mud in Cheshire.

The October 25th long walk was fairly close to home, around Tarporley. The sun was out that day but not completely, we stopped at 10:45 in Eaton village to observe the partial solar eclipse using a pinhole device. It had been constructed that very morning using an old cereal box and other Blue Peter style essentials, guided by a modern essential, a Youtube video. I preferred Valerie Singleton, Joan Noakes and Shep.

The walk continued with fine views East towards Jodrell Bank and the Cheshire Plain, West towards the hills of Wales and South West towards Beeston Castle. It was quite a small group, just eight of us but we did manage to get separated at one point before clumping together again to continue our task of re-distributing the soils of Cheshire



on our boots. This included bringing some of it into a cafe in Tarporley despite our best efforts at tap dancing and improvised hokey cokeys outside. It did occur to me that I could supplement my modest but triple locked (so far) income by setting up a website which reviewed the willingness of eateries to accept muddy boots and long winded discussions about the relative merits of carrot cake and scones (cream or butter) and tea versus cappuccino. I checked and www.mud.co.uk has already been taken, by a "professional game design consultant" - the world's gone mad. The November short walk was very local, around Crowton and Acton Bridge with a stop at Dutton Locks to look at the recently completed hydro-electric installation and a discussion about megawatt hours and tonnes of carbon dioxide (www.hallidayshydropower.com/casestudy/dutton/). It did involve dodging showers and there was a bit of mud slinging going on at one particular point.

The walk was very well attended and most went on to a very enjoyable lunch at the Hazel Pear, muddy boots being exchanged for glamorous footwear in the car park prior to entry.

The Kingsley Sculptor.

Born and raised in Liverpool, Tony Evans retired to Kingsley 25 years ago where he lives with his wife Brenda and Bonnie the dog. He had imagined spending his days sorting out the garden, finding a part-time job and relaxing in the Cheshire country-side. But his life took a different direction, and the garden has had to wait! Since retiring, he has become an acclaimed artist and his time has been spent producing copper and bronze sculptures for galleries, institutions, private collectors around the country, as well as a fair number of Kingsley residents.

How did it all begin?

Tony was offered early retirement from the insurance company he had worked for in Liverpool for thirty years. He had witnessed distasteful changes in the job and was happy to leave despite the small pension. Whilst Brenda still had a year to work before retirement, he used the opportunity to turn to his long-suppressed love of art. What began as a simple watercolour painting class, five years later had led to a string of qualifications culminating in a B.A. Honours Degree in Fine Arts, at the age of fifty-eight, from Wirral Metropolitan College. During his time at college, one of Tony's tutors suggested he tried his hand at sculpting as he had shown a leaning towards shapes and movement. He began by sketching his subjects, then making a wire model before using recycled copper and other metals to capture the movement and beauty of the piece.

During his degree course Tony was approached by Lever Faberge. He was commissioned to supply 3 large sculptural panels where they remain today in the permanent collection in the Leveson Gallery, Port Sunlight. This was the first step to realising this venture could be more than just a hobby!

Having graduated, the College offered him a year's Fellowship which enabled him to develop his skills further and provided him with the opportunity to exhibit his work at the end of the year in the Williamson Gallery, Birkenhead. All his exhibits sold and so it was dawning on him that he could make an income out of the art he loved to create. Could this be the part-time job he was seeking? Further success followed when he was asked to exhibit at Southport's Atkinson Gallery amongst renowned artists such as Alfred Munnings. This attracted the attention of many in the art world, including an agent who took on the task of pricing Tony's work and selling it to galleries around the country. This helped launch the business side of the venture.

It wasn't long before Tony's talent drew the attention of the media. He has appeared in several television series including Nick Knowles' "Home Is Where the Art Is," and "Scrap Kings". Having won the competition in Paul Martin's "Handmade in Britain," his work was to be exhibited in the Victoria and Albert Museum. A high accolade for any artist. The sculpture that won the contest wasn't ever displayed as it was sold whilst being unwrapped! However, Tony was asked to send a substitute. Certainly, a

good addition to his CV.

Other most notable works have included a commemorative World War One piece for Chester Cathedral, an impressive crucifix, and a beautiful nativity tableau. Unlike a static scene, the figures in the nativity scene are processional. They are placed at various stages of the nativity story during the days leading up to the birth of Christ and beyond to the Epiphany. This had its challenges in

cluding the creation of two

Mary's to depict before and after the birth! To his credit, Tony's work is not just for Christmas but is on permanent display in the Cathedral and well worth a look.

Not surprisingly, Tony's work often evokes an emotional response from those who receive it. He felt honoured to be asked to make sculptures of the Liverbirds for several families of the victims of the Hillsborough disaster. An emotional commission for Tony, meeting the families who have been through so much.



And today?

Tony continues to create his sculptures in his garden workshop, remaining true to his original ideas, using recycled materials whenever possible. He produces a range of work, but his birds and animals especially, show case his ability to capture movement and the beauty of nature. Tony himself has a particular love of horses and has created several sculptures of diverse sizes, including life-size! Despite his achievements, Tony modestly claims he still feels like an insurance man with a hobby! His work defies any idea of a mere hobby.

And the garden still waits.....



Kingsley Parish Council - November 2022

The Parish Council met on the 15th November for the final meeting of 2022. There were three members of the public in attendance, two of which were representing Kingsley Players Youth Theatre, as well as a prospective new Parish Councillor in an observational role. KPYT addressed the meeting seeking funding for the young members of KYPT to undertake a workshop as part of a joint venture with the National Theatre. KPYT advised that this will allow young members to benefit from the experience of professional actors and directors from the National Theatre. They sought the grant funding as part of matched funding with a donation received from Arnold Clark Community Fund. KPC listened sympathetically to their request and will consider the funding at the next Parish Council meeting.

Work has now been completed to repair all the fallen and damaged headstones in the cemetery. The cost of the works has be borne by the Parish Council, as the Council's insurers were reluctant to pay for any works in the cemetery. Grave owners are therefore advised that in future they would be responsible for the cost of any repairs, and you are advised to take out appropriate insurance.

The Parish Council is in discussion with CWAC regarding a proposal to take over the operation and maintenance of the Middle Lane playing fields. KPC await the details and costs associated with the existing operation before deciding whether to take on this additional facility. Should KPC decide to adopt the playing field operation, it will require a notional increase in the precept.

The Parish Council agreed to proceed with CWAC to establish Community Orchards at Middle Lane and Kingsley Playing Fields. Planting of any trees will now take place in the early spring 2023. We have once again spread wildflower seeds on the areas at the top of the playing field. We would respectfully request that everyone please keep off these areas, please ensure dogs and children are not allowed to stray onto or, dig up these areas. The display this year (our first ever year of a wildflower meadow), was widely acknowledged as outstanding, and we look forward to a larger and more stunning display in 2023.

The RoSPA recommended repairs to the play equipment in the children's are have all now been completed and regular inspections are undertaken by the Parish Clerk who is now qualified to undertake RoSPA inspections. Please respect the equipment.

Once again KPC will be erecting a Christmas Tree in the village on the raised area outside St John's School. This will be in addition to lights on one tree at The Brow, and trees on the Co-op. The works will be undertaken by Parish Councillors during early December. It is hoped that next year we will have additional lights at The Brow to replace those damaged in Storm Arwen earlier this year.

Finally there will be no Parish Council meeting in December, the next meeting will be on the 17th January 2023. The Parish Councillors wish all our residents a Very Happy and a Peaceful Christmas in these very challenging times.
