# 'One Man, Two Guvnors'



### Reviewed

This hilarious, energetic production was the latest entertainment provided by the talented Kingsley Players, much to the enjoyment of packed audiences in October.

Having seen the National Theatre production some years ago, the directors, Dylan and Kelly White, were keen to bring this play to Kingsley.

The play is an adaptation by Richard Bean of an eighteenth century play by Carlo Goldini, "A Servant of Two Masters". The play follows the story of Francis Henshall, a man who finds himself working for two employers who are unaware of each other's existence, leading to a series of hilarious comedic misunderstandings and mishaps. As the director explains, Bean sets the play in 1960s Brighton, using "the slightly bawdy humour of the saucy postcard and the music of the period to create a fast-paced, highenergy riot of laughs". The seaside setting is reflected in the colourful backdrop of sticks of rock. The furniture and fittings of the sitting room scenes captured the style of the 60s. As ever, the skilful production team who built the set, managed the props and set changes, organised the costumes, and provided the appropriate lighting and sound, did a great job to help bring this play to life.

The play attracted talented actors from around the area making their debut in Kingsley, as well as some well-known and much-loved members of the Kingsley Players. The acting was certainly demanding, but the cast rose brilliantly to the challenge. Their timing and slick choreography was impressive. The sheer athleticism of some of the roles, most notably that of Francis, played by David Rogerson, was exhausting to watch and a highlight of the show

Those involved in the memorable mealtime scene were applauded for their coordination as a team and pulling off a very tricky (verging on slapstick) scene so well. It soon became apparent that the "volunteer" from the audience who became caught in the crossfire of flying food was a well-known face from the Kingsley players' members! In a previous scene, audience participation meant two gentlemen from the audience being unwittingly caught up in the onstage action. Note to self....don't book front row seats!

An added delight to the evening was provided by the music of the "Kingy Skifflers" and ensemble. Their wide repertoire of ten songs from the 60s, set feet tapping and even inspired communal singing, especially for many of us who remembered those songs the first time around!

As many audience members who had seen the West End version of the play commented, Kingsley's performance was as good, if not better than the professionals'. Accolade indeed! Congratulations to all involved and thanks for a thoroughly enjoyable evening.



#### KINGSLEY COMMUNITY ORCHARD



Between November 26 - December 4 it's National Tree Week and the Parish Council has been investigating how to increase Kingsley's tree canopy to make our green spaces more environmentally friendly.

Orchards provide local harvests for everyone on their doorstep and sadly have been in national decline with 60% lost since the 1950s, and a staggering 75% lost in the North West.

We all know that trees are a great way to combat pollution, reduce noise, reduce flooding risks and provide shelter to wildlife. However, orchards are also important for providing locally grown food, which in turn helps to reduce food miles, and support our vital ecosystems.

It can be difficult for newly planted saplings to establish. So, we need your help!

Join us in the new year for a community orchard planting day on Thursday 11 January 2024 at 10am in Kingsley Playing Field.

As well as planting, we are also calling out to residents to help where they can by keeping an eye on the young trees, watering them when the weather is hot, and reporting any problems.

We hope you will join us for our first planting event - if you come along, please wear appropriate footwear and bring a spade.

## KINGSLEY PARISH COUNCIL



The Parish Council meeting was held on Tuesday 21st November 2023, at the Kingsley Community Centre, no members of the public were present.

On the weekend 4/5th November, a small number of Parish Councillors managed to get out and undertake some tidying jobs, plant three replacement trees on Brookside, and cut back the raised bed outside Kingsley St John's Primary School to create space for the arrival of this year's Christmas Tree. The weather wasn't great but most of the main jobs were completed.

It is proposed that our next village tidy-up will take place in Spring 2024 (date to be confirmed in the New Year). If anyone is interested in making Kingsley look even smarter by helping out, it would be great to have you join us. Watch this space (or, posts on Facebook, the village website and the Parish Council website) for more details nearer the time.

Those eagle eyed amongst you who were out and about on the evening of the 6/7th November, may have had a sneak preview of the new lights on the two trees at The Brow. The company providing them were installing and testing them around this time. You will all get a chance to view them around the 1st December when they are officially switched on. The village Christmas tree is being delivered 23rd November and will be erected by a number of Parish Councillors who will be decorating it at a later date ready for the switch on in early December.

The Remembrance Day service at the cenotaph in the Cemetery was well attended despite strong winds and rain. A very big thank you must go out to our Chair Councillor Judith Critchley, who gave up several hours each day the week before, to weed and tidy up the paths leading to and in the cemetery to make it presentable for the wreath laying cemetery.

The old goal posts which were declared unsafe in a recent RoSPA inspection, have now been removed and replaced with two smaller goals and a reduced size pitch area.

Whist on the Playing Field, CWaC have now confirmed a delivery and planting date for the new Community Orchard, this will be Thursday 11th January 2024 at 10.00am. A Ranger will be coming to advise and assist in the planting, but CWaC are looking for a Community (your) input. So please come along, ideally with a spade, and help us to plant the first Community Orchard in Kingsley. Two Parish Councillors will be attending a fruit tree pruning course the following day, and will be leading pruning of the trees in the future as and when it is required. These are YOUR trees, and YOUR orchard, so please come along and help out now and in the future.

Finally, at a date yet to be confirmed in January, the Zip wire in the park will be out of use to the public. The RoSPA inspection identified essential routine maintenance required, this will require stripping down of the wire and its components so for a period of a few days will be unavailable for use.

Finally, the Parish Councillors and Proper Officer, wish you and your loved ones a very Happy and Peaceful Christmas and a Happy New Year.

# DID YOU ...... that puppets are back at the Hurst!!?
